Year 3

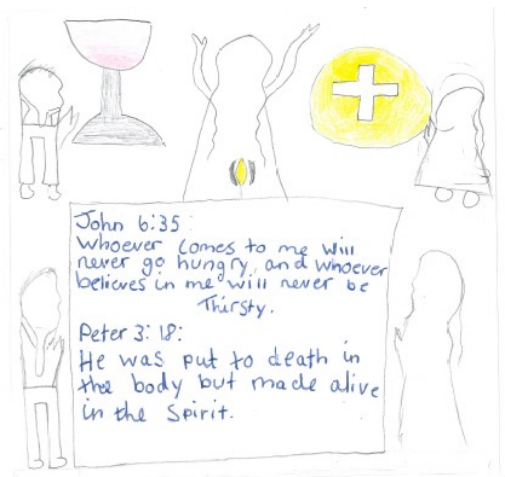

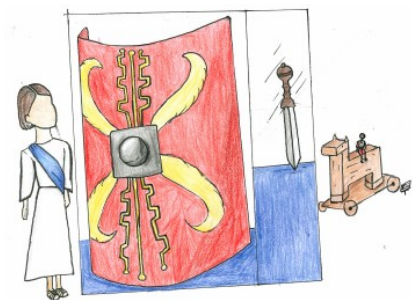


TEACHER FEATURE - Mr Whitfield

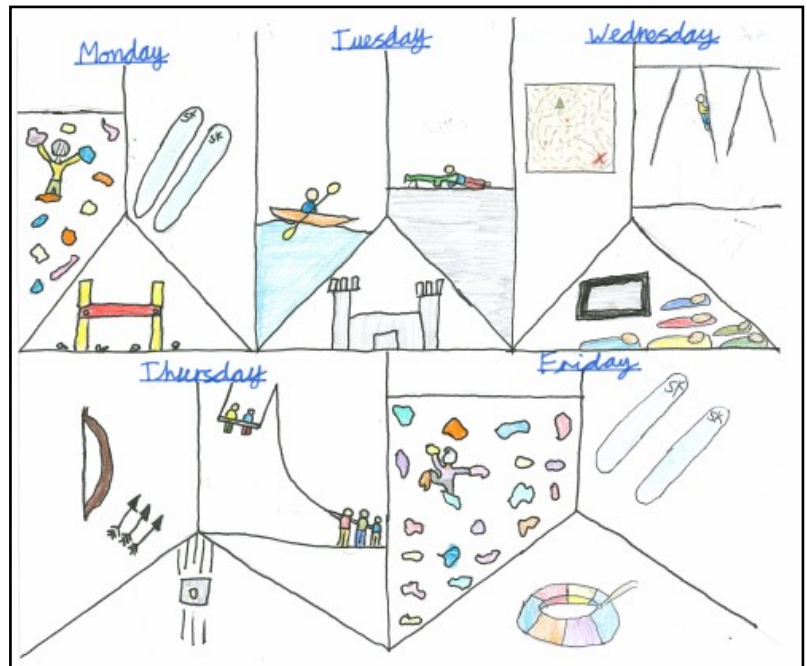

Part 2—Transition



In our last few weeks in Year 6 we have been using a special prayer programme from the Diocese called Abridge. The idea of Abridge is to reflect on our time at St Hugh's and think about our transition to secondary school.

In the first lesson we talked about Visio Divina. Visio divina is a form of Divine Seeing in which we prayerfully invite God to speak to our hearts as we look at an image. As we looked at the image we thought about some different questions and wrote our thoughts in our books. We all agreed that the picture showed Jesus in the role of the bridge, carrying across the divide. We disagreed on the direction the people were travelling. Some thought it was from the darkness into light, a metaphor for Jesus' love revealing the light. Others thought the people were going from the light into the dark, a metaphor for Jesus being there to care for us as we enter the unknown.

Don't worry about anything, but pray and ask God for everything you need, always giving thanks for what you have. And because you belong to Christ Jesus, God's peace will stand guard over all your thoughts and feelings. His peace can do this far better than our human minds.

Based on Philippians 4.

In the second lesson we learned about lectio divina (Divine reading). At first, we reflected on our transition by answering questions like "What are we looking forward to?" and "What worries us?". We then moved onto looking at Philippians 4. First we had to read the scripture carefully and thoroughly, out loud and then several times in our head. Once we had done that we could use a word or a few phrases...my favourite was 'God's peace will stand guard over your thoughts and feelings.' After that we had to respond by drawing a picture or writing our thoughts.

These are all the things we did so far. We have 7 more Abridge sessions to do. We are doing this to reflect on our time at St Hugh's and to think about how we can move on to our next school. We do this to think about our emotions and connect with God.
