


The children have been doing some great learning this week. Here's an insight into what they've been doing:

Year 1 science

Year 1 have been learning to identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body. They all worked in teams to create and label a body map. The children already knew lots of body parts including their knuckles, forehead and calves! Well done Year 1.





Year 4 art, science and RE


Year 4 wanted to share lots of learning with you this week.

The new topic in art is Texture, Pattern and Printing and the children started this week by experimenting with charcoal to see if they could express emotion, changing the textures they created.



In Science, year 4 have started to learn all about electricity and they had great fun learning how to build simple circuits, making buzzers and light bulbs work.





And finally in RE, the new year 4 topic is People so the children created their own family trees because in this topic they will learn about Jesus' ancestry and the family of God in scripture.

Year 6 Faith in Action Awards

Year 6 received some exciting news this week when we told them about an exciting new scheme they are all going to participate in called the, "Faith in Action Awards." The scheme is run by the Catholic Youth Ministry Federation of England and Wales and is comprised of 4 levels: the pin, bronze, silver and gold. Our year 6 class are going to work towards their pin this year by undertaking a collaborative project to create an outward expression of their faith by designing and bringing to life a new faith garden that will serve the whole school community.

You may remember that I put a request in the newsletter before the summer break asking if anyone knew a garden designer who might be willing to volunteer with year 6 on the project. A fantastic designer called Angela Wilson got in touch and offered to work with our year 6 children and we were lucky enough to welcome her into school to meet the children on Wednesday. She spent some time talking to the children about their ideas and vision for the faith garden and got them to vote on a theme. The theme of a "creation garden" was the clear winner and the children are going to work with Angela to design a special space telling the creation story. Before she went, she set the children some work to measure out the site and triangulate the trees to produce a plan for her to work with. We'll keep you updated as the project moves along. Our year 6 team will be trying to fundraise, find sponsorship and organise volunteer working groups as their design is realised, so if you know of any sources of help please let us know. Needless to say the children's ideas are much bigger than the current budget we have available to us!
