Christmas and Advent Celebration Dates

Christmas time at primary school is always such a special time of a child's life and over the last few years the traditional performances and celebrations that are so magical for both parents and children have had to be cancelled. This year, we're hoping to be able to invite parents to the reception and KS1 nativity play and to the KS2 Advent reflection although we need to make a few changes to guest numbers to try and make the events as Covid secure as we possibly can. Unfortunately, it also goes without saying that these plans are subject to constant review and if the Covid risk is deemed too high we may have to make changes at short notice. For all events whether at the school or church we would ask you to wear a mask and not attend if you have any Covid symptoms.

The Nativity Play (yr R, 1 and 2)

We are planning 3 performances so that we can control capacity in the hall. Each child will be allowed a maximum of two guests at the nativity play and we are asking you to book your places on Scopay. Booking is now open. In the comments box, please let us know if you will require one or two 'tickets'.

Tuesday 7th December 2.15pm – performance for the parents and carers of reception class children

Wednesday 8th December 2.15pm – performance for the parents and carers of year 1 children

Thursday 9th December 2.15pm – performance for the parents and carers of year 2 children

Unless there are any safeguarding issues that arise between now and then, parents will be allowed to take photographs but we ask that these are not shared on social media and are kept for personal use only. The Friends are going to be filming the performance and will sell the DVD to raise money for the school.

Advent Reflection (yr 3, 4, 5, 6)

We are going to do 2 performances of the Advent Reflection, one at church and one at school.

The church performance is scheduled to take place at 6pm on Tuesday 30th November. This performance is far more challenging to manage in a Covid-safe way due to the numbers of children, parents and the capacity of the church. In order to comply with the capacity limits, we are going to live stream the performance and invite one guest for each year 5 and 6 child. The children in years 3, 4, 5 and 6 will participate in the performance.

We're going to do another performance of the Advent Reflection at 2pm on Wednesday 1st December at school. Again, years 3, 4, 5 and 6 are going to participate in the performance and this time we will invite one guest per child from years 3 and 4.

Again, unless there are any safeguarding issues that arise between now and then, parents will be allowed to take photographs but we ask that these are not shared on social media and kept for personal use only. The Friends are going to film the performance and will sell DVDs to raise money for the school.

Sorry we've had to restrict numbers, but hopefully next year we can get back to normal!

Pedestrian Safety, Autumn 2021 campaign - Drive SMART

St Hugh's are happy to support the following campaign which has been organised by Surrey Safer Roads Partnership. We regularly talk to the children about road safety and will make sure we reinforce the message again during the campaign. We're happy to share the following:

This Autumn Drive SMART, Surrey Safer Roads Partnership will be launching a new campaign to provide education and engagement on the importance of pedestrian safety across the county. Recent data has shown that, in Surrey, pedestrian casualties make up to 9% of all casualties in the county. Although these numbers are lower than those seen in other areas on the country, Drive SMART believe that pedestrians in Surrey require a dedicated campaign, engaging with the most affected age groups and those travelling at "peak" times, to remind them of the safety precautions that can keep themselves and others safer on the road, particularly during the darker evenings.

This campaign will be focused on engagement with pedestrians – raising awareness of their vulnerabilities and ways in which to keep safe on the roads – and drivers, to educate them on their role in keeping these road users safe, in particular around school-zones and residential areas.

This dedicated campaign will run from Monday 1st November to Sunday 19th December, with the desired outcomes being:

- Drivers are more considerate to the dangers posed to pedestrians by unsafe driving practices and are encouraged to improve their driving habits to help this cause in keeping these vulnerable road users safe.
- · For pedestrians in Surrey to feel safer using the roads, especially around school-zones and residential areas with the help of reflective devices/clothing, using designated crossings, removing distractions etc. and for this to then be reflected in the data from this Autumn/Winter period.

10–14-year-olds were the highest age band between 2018-20 to be represented in the data. School age pedestrians travelling to and from school is clearly a risk and the overwhelming majority for vehicle type interacting with the pedestrian casualties (79%) is cars. Therefore, tactics deployed throughout this campaign will aim to target drivers, schools, children and parents/guardians with cohesive key-messages and themes represented through radio airtime, bus advertisements and social media posts.
