Reception

Year R were amazing in their liturgy with Fr Nick this morning. They sang their hearts out and it was enjoyed by all the parents and siblings!

In RE we were talking about what we would do to prepare if Jesus was to come and visit. The children came up with fabulous ideas in their continuous provision...... A vehicle was made by David so that Jesus would be able to get around to visit all his people. A pancake was made by Pebble and Hattie with a sign of the cross on it.

Dens were made 'beautiful' for Jesus' arrival, Alessandro made his house with heart balloons around it to show Jesus that he loved him.

Mrs Grace came into our class to tell us what she does to be close to Jesus. The children loved hearing how she prays and goes to church and that being kind was the most important way to be close to Jesus.













This week, the children were very excited to be able to do their science learning in the outdoor classroom. Throughout this term, we have been identifying different materials and objects within our school environment. All the children were able to identify and classify a range of materials and objects.





This week Year 2 have been continuing their learning in Science-Feeding and Exercise. They really enjoyed sorting and classifying different foods that humans eat and deciding whether they were plant based, animal based or dairy based. They had a few surprises and challenges with some foods like cakes and honey, but after lots of discussion they were able to come up with the answers. Well done Year 2 for working together as scientists in your teams.



In maths we have been learning about shape and angles. This week we constructed 3D shapes and thought about the properties of the shapes using the vocabulary, faces, vertices and edges. In art we are making sculptures inspired by Robert Morris and Anthony Caro. We have been learning different joining techniques.












The year 4 children have been evaluating torches this week as part of their DT unit on torches. They had great fun identifying features of different types of torches and relating it to the need the user may have. Many that were brought in from home were waterproof, bright and easily carried. The children highlighted these features as being the most important when considering the situations a torch may be used in. They look forward to future lessons where they will be designing their torches based upon a set of criteria, they feel would meet a consumer's needs. This will involve creating their own circuits and switches. We were impressed with the great evaluative skills the children displayed throughout this lesson. Well done year 4!



Year 5 this week worked on their team building and problem solving skills. The first activity they had to order themselves in order of their birthdays without talking and they completed it in an impressive 5 minutes. They then had coloured stickers on their heads and had to organise themselves into groups with the same colours as themselves without communicating. The final activity involved a box of random objects. One member of the team had a look in the box and acted out what the object was to the next team member who passed the information onto the final person who write down the list of all the objects. The adults found the acting out very amusing to watch! Fantastic team work year 5 - well done!



On Wednesday, Year 6 went in a coach up to London. We went to the Houses of Parliament first and had an amazing tour. We got to go into the House of Lords and stand where they would have debates when looking to pass new bills. We also got to see where the King would enter when he opens parliament and reads the King's speech. After our tour, we had a debating workshop where we debated about whether we should have a 3-day weekend... we decided that a 3-day weekend should be law. It was lovely weather, so we decided to have lunch in the sun outside which was followed by a walk to Buckingham palace and then the national gallery. We had a great time but we're ready for bed after all the walking and sightseeing!
