Dear parents and carers, Mark 1:21-28


Entries need to be submitted by Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> February.

#### Curriculum Team

The curriculum team have now decided that Geography and History are areas they feel they could help with in the school after their great success with Science. They are going to conduct a survey to gauge opinions of year groups 1-6 about their Geography and History learning. This is obtaining 'pupil voice'. # Reception - Saint Bernadette

Reception have been using the story of *Oliver's Vegetables* as a platform for exploring healthy eating and the importance of a balanced diet. Perhaps they could try eating a new fruit or vegetable at home like Oliver! Additionally, we have been exploring how to look after our teeth. The children understand that too much sugar can be harmful to our teeth. They have enjoyed applying what they have learnt about how to brush their teeth properly remembering to use a pea-sized amount of toothpaste, brushing in small circular motions on all surfaces of all teeth for 2 minutes. Remember to always brush your teeth before bed and at 1 other time every day!

# Year I - Saint George

This week in Science we have been investigating objects that float and sink. We carried about an investigation to check if our predictions were correct or not. We learnt that not all heavy items sink due to buoyancy. If an item is more dense than water it will sink or if it is less dense than water it will float.

This week in Geography we have been looking closely at the continent of Africa. We used the atlas' to help us understand where Africa is and what the temperature is like. Our key vocabulary for this week was using the word 'equator'.

## Year 2 - Saint Francis

This week we have been very busy in Year 2! We have been writing a letter to our main character (the fox) persuading him to not give up in his journey, in maths we finished our unit about money and now we started a new learning about multiplication. In Science we have been testing different objects and analysing which materials are squashy, in Geography we looked into detail the food journey of milk from the farm to our shops and in RE we were learned about the different types of books we use in mass. Our art lessons have been the highlight of our week: we made patterned paper that showed the texture of grass, sky, rocky mountains and brick house in order to create our collages based on a landscape. Then we assembled the pieces of texture paper and magazine paper into our collages. It required a lot of patience to cut such tiny pieces and stick them next to and overlapping each other without leaving any gaps, but we are really proud of resilience and how it they are all looking! Next week we will finish our art collages. They are going to look incredible!

Our orange words are still: caught, child, children, continue, decide, describe


# Year 4 - Saint Teresa of Calcutta


This week in Religious Education, the Year 4 children carried on learning more about their current topic 'Community'. Children made links between St Paul's advice and the actions of parish ministries and were able to show their understanding of how St Paul's advice can be lived out in the Parish Community. Children were asked to write a poem on how to follow St Paul's advice 'be real about loving'.

Our spelling rule this week is: adding -ation to verbs to form nouns. e.g. preparation, information.

# Year 5 - Saint Raphael

We had a very successful Science week! The children learned what dissolving meant by and experimented with different solids to see if they will dissolve in water. ! We had an interesting discussion about coffee and tea leaves and whether they were dissolvable or not. We found that tea leaves do not dissolve but coffee granules does.

We also had an experiment with filter paper in our filtration experiment to see if sand and water can be filtered. They noticed that the water that was filtered through the filter paper is slightly cleaner than what it was before filtering, but still not drinkable.

## Year 6 - Saint Maximilian Kolbe

The year 6 children had a great time this week as they completed some Geography Fieldwork relating to eco-sustainability evident within local area. As they walked a set route, they looked for things like solar technology, evidence of recycling and litter. This related to their unit of work 'Protecting the Environment'. Once back in the classroom, the children wrote a letter in their Geography books to the local council to advise them what could be done to ensure the local area was more eco-sustainable. Miss Wisdom was very impressed with some of the great ideas the children had as to how this could be achieved. Many suggested a government initiative to make it more possible for homeowners to afford to put solar panels on their houses. They also suggested more charging points for cars to make this a more feasible mode of transport for more people. The behaviour of the children on this trip was exemplary, great work year 6!
