Surrey County Council Parking monitoring

Reception - Saint Bernadette

This half term, Reception are exploring, "I wonder how the food we eat changes?" This week, they have been reading the story of, The Little Red Hen and thinking about rural environments where many cereals are grown on farm land. The children were interested to learn about how flour is made from wheat and corn crops. In the story, Little Red Hen planted and grew her own corn and used a windmill to grind it down into flour but Reception worked their gross and fine motor skills to grind the wheat using pestle and mortars. They were surprised by what hard work it was but they were so excited when they were able to see the flour starting to form! The children are excited to make their own bread next week just like Little Red Hen!







Year I - Saint George

This week we have learning about the Presentation of Jesus and how different countries celebrate Candlemas. Today we learnt that in European countries, people traditionally eat pancakes in a festive atmosphere on Candlemas Day.

At that time of the year, the excess flour was used to make pancakes (or *crêpes*), a symbol of prosperity for the coming year. *Crêpes*, with their round shape and golden colour, reminded people of the sun's return after the winter's night. We also recognised the light of the sun is similar to the light of Jesus. As a group we created the crêpe mixture using eggs, flour and milk and then we individually made our own crêpes.

Year 2 - Saint Francis

We have had such a lovely and busy first week back after the holidays! We have been writing detailed descriptions about the setting of our new book in English, using similes to embellish our writing. In maths we finished our topic about shapes, in Art we have been exploring secondary colours and shades when mixing different amounts of primary colours and in RE we started our new topic about Holy Bible and Bible stories. In science we had a very fun lesson testing how playdough can change the shape if we apply different forces: squish, bend, twist or stretch. It was very interesting to analyse how much energy and force we need to apply depending on the quantity of the playdough taken.

Our Topic in RE is Journey's we will be learning about our journey through the year with Jesus. We started by thinking about seasons and how things change and grow during the year. Using different mediums we created our own picture of a year. We will be looking at the liturgical calendar – ordinary times and feast days – and how we mark these times.


In Art this week, the children began their new topic 'Light and Dark' with the lesson objective this week to learn the skill of mixing paint colours to create tints and shades.

Year 5 - Saint Raphael

















Year 6 - Saint Maximilian Kolbe

During this lesson the children looked at different types of living things and sorted them into different groups based upon their own criteria. They then went onto learning about the difference between vertebrates and invertebrates and further sorted these animals using this knowledge. It was lovely to see how many great ways of sorting the children initially came up with, many of them identifying features of animals to further classify them such as whether they hand an endoskeleton or exoskeleton.
