RSE – Journey In Love

The learning intention for each year group is:

Year 1: To celebrate ways that God loves and cares for us.

Year 2: To celebrate ways of meeting God in our communities.


Year 3: To celebrate the joy and happiness of living in friendship with God and others.

Year 4: To celebrate the uniqueness and innate beauty of each of us.

Year 5: To celebrate the joy of growing physically and spiritually.

Year 6: To show an understanding of how being made in the image and likeness of God informs decisions and actions when building relationships with others, including life-long relationships.

Reception

Reception have been exploring the story of, *The Good Samaritan*. They have used 'small world' resources to retell and act out the story. They have even made some puppets of their own to represent the people from the story to help them with their own storytelling. The children have thought carefully about the message of the story and have thought of ways that they can show kindness and love towards others, particularly during this period of Lent. The children then wrote their own Lenten Promises to hang on the class prayer table.





In Art this week, we have worked in groups of 4 to recreate Louis Bourgeois' 'Maman' spider sculpture. We have used our art skills to plan and create the legs and body of the spider. Year 1 thoroughly enjoyed their afternoon visit to see the Science Fair entries. A big thank you to Mr Davies and the curriculum team.









Year 2 have enjoyed making and decorating Mother's Day cards for their parents and family to celebrate the special day on Sunday. They loved using the colouring markers and choosing materials to make their cards 'sparkle'.





This week, Year Three acted out the actions of the Communion Rite in their RE lesson. They then freeze framed and explained what was happening. They also thought about how they can share God's love with others:

"Be kind to others."

"Talk about the Gospel we have heard."


"Smile at people in the street."

Year 5 enjoyed using our lovely, new outdoor classroom for their Geography lesson. This term, in Geography Year 5 are studying the Alpine region. Last week, they learnt about how the Alps were formed. To help picture the process the children used playdough to represent the tectonic plates. Then they placed their plates on a thin layer of sand and pushed two plates together, observing how the layers crumple and fold, creating 'mountains'.



This week, Year 6 have been learning how to find their internal pulse. We listened to different songs and found the pulse(heartbeat) of the song. We also created our own class cup song.







Science Fair

The St Hugh of Lincoln 2023 Science Fair has taken place this week. It was lovely to see some of the amazing work produced across the school. There were examples of detailed investigations that had taken place covering all areas of the science curriculum. There were also many research projects that centred on famous scientists and their discoveries. Children across the school were given the time to visit the fair and then later in the week parents, relatives and friends were invited in to see some of the great work produced. The Curriculum Team have worked hard to help judge some of the entries and produced posters to encourage parents to visit during the after school session. Well done team!

We look forward to taking some of the winning KS2 projects to the grand final at Royal Holloway University later this month when the children will have the opportunity to look at other projects produced by other schools and visit some of the exhibits that are run by people working in the field of science.





Swimming Lessons for Year 5 and 6

The national Curriculum states that:

All schools must provide swimming instruction either in key stage 1 or key stage 2. In particular, pupils should be taught to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres. In line with this, we are delighted to be able to offer swimming instruction at school for years 5 and 6 during the summer term. There will be a charge for this however, the children will benefit from a whole week of swimming lessons in focussed groups on our site. All children will get this fantastic opportunity when they are in year 5 and Year 6. Medical Advice – Frimley health Authority

Frimley Healthier Together has asked us to share the following information.

They would like to support parents and carers in feeling more confident to provide self-care for unwell babies, children, and young people, alongside knowing when and where to seek further medical help based upon symptoms, NHS Frimley are hosting an online event with local GP's, Dr Alex Streeter de Diego and Dr Sabina Shaik.

Together, they will guide parents, carers, and professionals through the Frimley Healthier Together website and App, demonstrating:

- How to find NHS traffic light guidance on symptoms like fever or cold.
- How to find local support services for children and young people e.g., mental health support.
- Symptoms that mean a child can go about their usual daily routine, and those that mean they should stay home to recover.
- Content within the Healthier Together App, and how to download it.
- Plus, they will be hosting a Q&A session.

Expected to last around 45 minutes, the session will run at **13:00 on Tuesday 21st March**, online.
