




ST HUGH'S ART FESTIVAL

The focus will be on the British pop artist Sir Eduardo Paolozzi. On 2nd and 7th of May children will be joining a workshop where they will study some of his works and then will have the opportunity to creatively respond. Children will be planning and creating their own ceramic tiles, with a focus on building different skills according to the different year groups' developmental stages and therefore achieving the National Curriculum outcomes. The festival will culminate in an St Hugh's Art Exhibition on Friday 17th May, which all students, staff and parents will be invited to. Votes will be cast to choose the favourite pieces, which will then form a unique, permanent, whole school art installation.

The cost of this workshop (materials, creation of and delivery of the final piece) is **£4.50** per child in Scopay.







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Reception - Saint Bernadette

This week, the Reception children have been exploring 3-D shapes. They have really enjoyed sorting 3-D shapes, finding out which shapes are good at rolling and using the 3-D shapes to make 'footprints' in playdough in order to find 2-D shapes!

Year 2 - Saint Francis

In Year 2 we have ad an amazing first week back after the holidays. In English we read and performed an acrostic poem about spring and at the end of the week we wrote our own spring poems. In maths we learned how to measure volume and temperature, understanding the difference in between a millilitre and a litre and using thermometers to read the temperature of different places. In RE we listened to the story of Resurrection and we sequenced it with our partners and in Science we learned that a habitat is a place where an animal or plant lives and it must be safe, have shelter and suitable food around it. In Art we practised different skills about how to manipulate clay and change the shape of clay. The highlight of our week was Geography. Our new topic is called Our Wonderful World. Today we went outside and explored around the school's playground, identifying what are the wonders of St Hugh of Lincoln. We all agreed that one of our precious wonders is the Prayer Garden and the beautiful, vibrant field and flower beds. We are so lucky to be part of a school full of wonders!

2) DOUBLE THE CONSONANT: trip –tripped, 3) DROP THE E: tickle - tickled

Recap these red words: beautiful, children, door, floor, everybody, grass.
