Reception

On Tuesday, Reception had a wonderful day at Painshill Park. The children were so engaged during their 'minibeast safari' as they explored different habits and the creatures that live there. In the afternoon, they enjoyed a scenic lakeside walk where they were lucky enough to see some families of geese with their gorgeous goslings! Finally, the children were very excited to enter the crystal grotto! The children were so beautifully behaved and were a real credit to our school! Throughout this term, the children have been very excited to follow the progress of a number of nesting birds. This week we have continued learning about plants. After watching a video, the children had to spot the differences between different types of trees in summer and winter. We went on a tree hunt and then created a poster all about evergreen and deciduous trees.

On Thursday, we enjoyed our coronation lunch in the hall. Thank you Mrs Small. Please note the **Y1 Class Liturgy is being rescheduled** – we will send out the new date as soon as it is confirmed.













Year 2 have been out and about this week exploring the school grounds. They were learning about micro habitats in their Science lesson. They were able to tally the number of mini beasts that they found in the different locations around the school and then give reasons why the mini beasts might want to live there.







This week in Science, Year 3 have been investigating the functions of different parts of plants. They took a close look at roots from different plants and compared them, and talked about how the roots help the plant to grow. They also talked about the functions of the stem, and conducted an experiment to help them see the water being transported around the plant. The children placed one stem in red food colouring, and one in blue, and were very excited to monitor the flowers throughout the day, as they watched the white petals slowly change colour. They even managed to split a stem in half, and make flowers which were half red and half blue!




The year 4 children have been using textile techniques to develop patterns this week in their art lesson. At the beginning of the lesson they looked at several William Morris pieces of art and discussed the different types of patterns present and the inspiration for these. They then took last lessons images and used pencil to trace and transfer patterns onto into their artbook through the use of a printing technique. They had great fun rotating and repeating patterns to create a variety of fun symmetrical patterns. Further on within this unit of work they will be using these patterns to use a batik technique to print onto fabric. I have been impressed with the attention to detail the children have made with each stage of the design process. Great work year 4!



A few tips for Year 6 Parents for SATS week

Try to keep everything else running normally. So whether its sport, music lessons or Scouts and Guides; sticking to your normal routine of out of school activities demonstrates to your child that SATs are not the 'be all and end all' of year 6.

During the SATs week, whilst keeping to normal timetable, try to avoid late nights, as children will find sitting the tests tiring.

- 1. Try to make sure your child has some fresh air when they come home from school on test days and a good breakfast each morning.
- 2. Keep it in proportion. They are primary-school tests to gauge the education in the school and do not affect the secondary school your child will go to.
- 3. Stay positive. Many children enjoy taking the tests as they see it as a challenge and like the importance and the feeling of being special that SATs give year 6.

Xavier Trust Student Wellbeing Survey

The survey is anonymous and will not give individual child data, it will create whole school data only. The Trust will use this data to monitor student wellbeing in individual schools and across the Trust as a whole. 


Student Subjective Wellbeing Questionnaire

Research has shown how various types of student subjective well-being are related to positive educational outcomes. Student subjective well-being has been shown to correlate positively with achievement (particularly in primary school students) and feeling accepted and fitting in at school (particularly in secondary school students). The SSWQ is a 16-item self-report instrument for assessing youths' subjective wellbeing at school, which has 4 subscales measuring school connectedness, academic efficacy, joy of learning, and educational purpose.

School connectedness is linked to levels of anxiety and Emotionally Based School Avoidance (EBSA). Subscale scores can be used as standalone wellbeing indicators or summed to create a Overall Student Wellbeing composite scale.
