At the end of Key Stage 1 and the end of Key Stage 2 100% of Pupil Premium eligible pupils achieved the Expected standard in each of reading, writing and mathematics.

Throughout 2017-2018 we ran a homework club, to which all Key Stage 2 children with Pupil Premium eligibility were invited. We provided mathematics and grammar intervention groups throughout the year, run by teachers before the start of the normal school day. Children with Pupil Premium entitlement were targeted, and this helped to achieve the progress and attainment that was achieved at the end of Key Stage 2. Additionally intervention sessions have been run by teaching assistants during the school day, targeting pupils with Pupil Premium eligibility on a 1:1 basis or within a small group. It is on being able to provide additional adult support within and outside of the classroom that the large majority of Pupil Premium funding was spent. All Pupil Premium grant was used to enable additional adult contact with eligible pupils.

In addition to providing Maths and English support (through specific programs such as Fischer Family Trust literacy, through precision teaching and through general in-class support with learning), support has been tailored to the needs of the individual child, eg. through providing emotional support (through Rainbows) and support for communication skills (Gingerbread).

We have been able to provide emotional literacy support through two trained members of staff, and this has benefitted pupils with Pupil Premium entitlement.
