






News at St Hughs

This week in Year 4, the children have had another brilliant week of learning. Year 5 – Saint Raphael

This week the children have been creating their own installation art in different groups by using everyday objects in the classroom. Installation art is large-scale, mixed-media constructions, often designed for a specific place or a temporary period of time. We have been discussing an artist called Cai Guo-Qiang who grew up during China's Cultural Revolution, make sure to ask them all about it. We had much fun yesterday!

Year 6 – Saint Maximilian Kolbe

In English this week the children have been creating a non-chronological report on the yellow spotted lizard. This lizard features in the book Holes, and is one of the creatures the main character Stanley mentions at the beginning of the book. Many were fascinated about this animal when they investigated some of its unusual qualities. The children round out that it has black teeth that can cut through metal and a poisonous venom that is often deadly to humans if they get bitten by the creature. The pieces of final work completed were of an excellent standard, with them including many important pieces of information from multiple sources that would be useful to anyone travelling in that part of the world where these creatures can be found. Great work year 6!
