Reception – Saint Bernadette

This week, Reception have been starting to learn about the huge range of key workers who help us all every day. On Tuesday, they were lucky enough to have a visit from Mr Morley, our school crossing patrol officer. He shared some details about his job including why he wears such a big bright jacket! He also reminded the children about how to cross safely and he asked us all (adults too!) to remember to stay on the pavement until he indicates that it is safe to cross. Thank you Mr Morley for all you do in helping to get members of our school community safely across the road and for giving up your time to come and inspire Reception class! The children were desperate to make their own lollipopos to practise what they had learnt!



Year 1 – Saint George

Within music this half term we are listening and appraising, as well as performing the song Hey You! By Joanna Mangona. The children have learnt that the style of this piece of music is called 'old school hip-hop'. This week we began by finding the pulse and we refer to this as the heartbeat of the song. Then, after our warm up section, we used our glockenspiels to stay in time with the pulse while playing the single note C.

For many of the children, this was their first introduction to using a glockenspiel and beater, so we focused on:

- Holding the beater.
- Bouncing the head of the beater off the note-bar to produce a good sound.
- Tapping the head of the beater gently in the centre of the bar.



Year 2 – Saint Francis

We have had a fantastic week in Year 2!

Writing postcards, comparing numbers to 100, learning about why we have different seasons in the year and making fact sheets in science are just some highlights of our great learning this week.

In Art we explored how to draw different textures using different types of materials, such as oil pastels, pencils and colour pencils. We described how the textures looked and felt and we used the materials to create patterns and textures of animals skins and objects around us. It was so much fun!



Year 3 – Saint Veronica

In DT we are learning about where our food comes from. This week we made fruit kebabs using fruit from around the world. We learnt where all the fruit came from and the different climates they need to grow. Next lesson we will be thinking about which fruit and vegetables are seasonal in the UK and making a seasonal crumble to share with our family.



Year 4 – Saint Teresa of Calcutta

Year 4 have had a great week of learning this week. This week as a class we have read and focused on chapter three of the Iron Man text. In English, the children have learnt about the features of a Newspaper Article. The Year 4 children were asked to write up an account of what Hogarth witnessed when he saw the Iron Man for the first time. All the children showed great focus and passion when writing up their Newspaper Article; which was lovely to see.

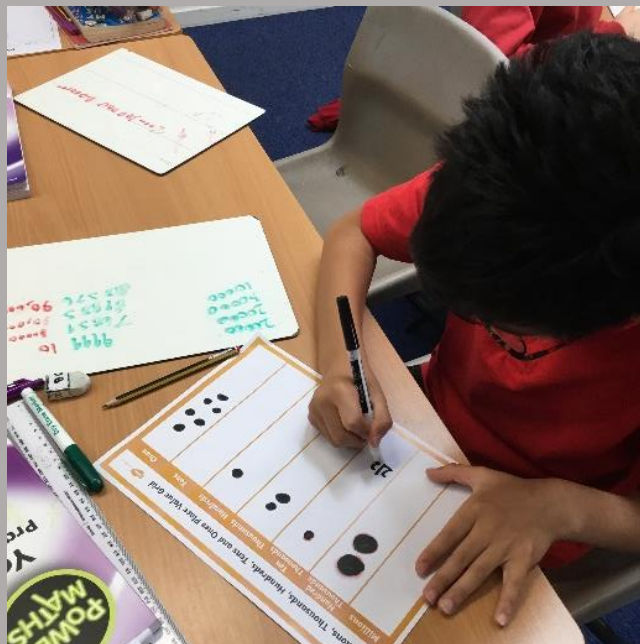
Following on, the children then had the chance in groups to roll play a interview in small groups, where the interviewees had great fun asking Hogarth questions about the Iron Man, and how his appearance made him feel. Children were asked apply particular focus to their sentence stems, prosody and projection of their voice when performing to the rest of the class.



Year 5 – Saint Raphael

Year 5 have had a great week, thoroughly enjoying delving deeper into our Place Value topic in Maths. The children have been rounding numbers to the nearest 10,000 using place value grids as well as comparing numbers to 1,000,000. The children have used concrete resources to help them, really enjoying the practical side and problem solving. They all had a go at challenges too!

Year 5 have enjoyed writing questions for a partner this week, based on their reading from 'Tom's Midnight Garden' by Philippa Pearce. The story is getting more and more intriguing and the class have also been predicting what might happen next.



Year 6 – Saint Maximilian Kolbe

As a class we investigated how we see things through conducting an investigation. The groups used cylinders with all light sources blocked and changed one variable to see how light affected the way we see things. Groups changed the size of holes, amount of holes, location of holes and the size of objects. Once they selected the method of investigation, they made sure they changed one variable only. All groups found that with more opportunities for light to enter the tube, they could see the object with greater clarity.
