Year I - Saint George

This week, Year 1 have written some beautiful diary entries. We have been working hard at remembering the features of a diary entry. We have been learning the importance of using a capital letter for the personal pronoun I. We have continued to up level our sentences by joining two simple sentences together with the word 'and'. We know that when we do this we create a compound sentence.

In maths we have been learning to name and recognise 3D shapes and in History we have been recognising the similarities and differences between toys from the 1950s and the toys we play with now. In RE we have been looking at the different ways Mary is honoured around the world. We created our own flowers and took a pilgrimage to our statue of Mary.






Our spelling rule this week is: CONTINUE FROM LAST WEEK

Most words that end in the *igh* sound are spelt with a y. For example: shy, dry, sky.

Our 6 red words are: me, house, children, who, why, what.







Year 3 - Saint Veronica

In Science, we have been enjoying our topic of 'Movement and Feeding'. This week we have been looking at the relationships between our body dimensions, and things we can do. We investigated the question 'Can the person with the biggest hands grab the largest amount of sweets?' We recorded our results, and began to look at scatter graphs. We then planned and carried out our own experiments, looking at other body dimension relationships.







