# Year 2 – Saint Francis

This term in Art, Year 2 pupils have been learning how to decorate clay tiles using impressing and joining techniques. Inspired by the work of artist Rachel Whiteread, the children explored how to create patterns and textures by pressing objects into clay. They began by discussing Whiteread's art and shared their ideas about her use of everyday shapes and spaces. Each pupil then rolled out a smooth tile of clay, learning how to handle the material with care. Using tools and small shapes, they added patterns by pressing into the clay and joining pieces onto it. The finished tiles look fantastic and show how creative and skilled our young artists have become!

# Year 6 – Saint Maximilian Kolbe

This week, our Year 6 pupils have proudly completed their memory boxes as the final part of their Art unit, *Making Memories*. This reflective and imaginative project has given the children an opportunity to explore their personal stories through art, while developing their creative skills. Inspired by the American artist Joseph Cornell, known for his poetic shadow boxes, the pupils designed and created their own memory boxes to hold objects that are meaningful to them. Each child selected items that represent important moments, people or experiences, and also made their own additions, including miniature sculptures, drawings and written pieces, to help tell their stories in a unique and thoughtful way. Colour was another key element in the design of the boxes. Pupils chose colours that held personal significance, using them to express their emotions and highlight the importance of the memories inside. Finishing their creations this week has marked a special moment in the unit. The memory boxes are not only a celebration of the pupils' creativity but also a powerful expression of who they are and the experiences that have shaped them. As they prepare to move on from primary school, this project has provided a meaningful way to reflect on their journeys and the memories they will carry forward.
