Reminders

Stock up your child's pencil case

Please ensure your child has a transparent pencil case with the following resources in it: handwriting pen with blue ink e.g. manuscript brand (not a biro), biro with purple ink for editing, pencil, 30cm ruler, rubber, sharpener, glue stick, whiteboard pen and a small selection of coloured pencils, no felt tips. Some children have started to bring in alternative pencil cases, if they don't have an appropriate pencil case, we will provide one (and charge parents on scopay) as we will be keeping a small stock in the school office. We will also keep a small stock of some other resources such as handwriting pens and glue sticks which we will give to children when they run out and then charge parents via Scopay.

Parking

For many years now, The Surrey pub have kindly let us use their car park at drop off and collection times. With limited parking available in the area, we have always felt very privileged to have this support from our neighbours at the pub. However, we are very sad to report that we have received a complaint advising us that there have been numerous incidents recently involving some of our parents. It has been reported that parents have been parking in the disabled bays when they do not have a blue badge, blocking gates, charging bays and fire exits, and blocking in their customers' cars. As mentioned, it is a huge privilege that The Surrey affords us and it would be a great loss to everyone, if they felt they had to take steps to prevent us from being allowed to use the car park in future.

To safeguard our relationship, please follow these simple rules when parking at the pub:

- Do not use the disabled parking bay unless you have a blue badge
- Do not block the rear gates, charging bays or any fire exits
- Do not block in any other cars
- If there are no spaces, either wait, or go somewhere else

School Absence

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

- 1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
- 2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
- 3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carer per child, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.
