# Year 2 – Saint Francis

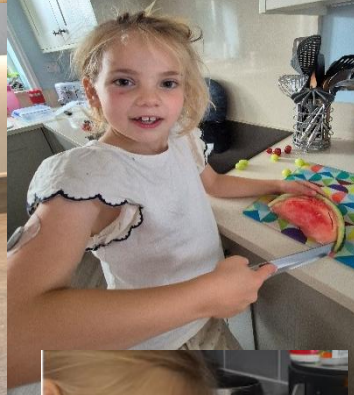

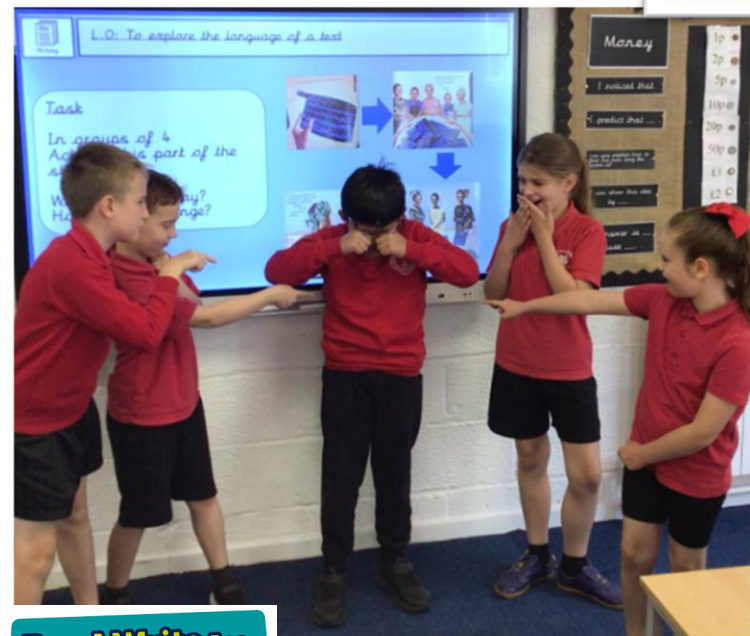

The children then used their reflections to write thoughtful book reviews, crafting balanced paragraphs that explored both the strengths and weaknesses of the story. Each review concluded with a personal recommendation, encouraging critical thinking and individual opinion.

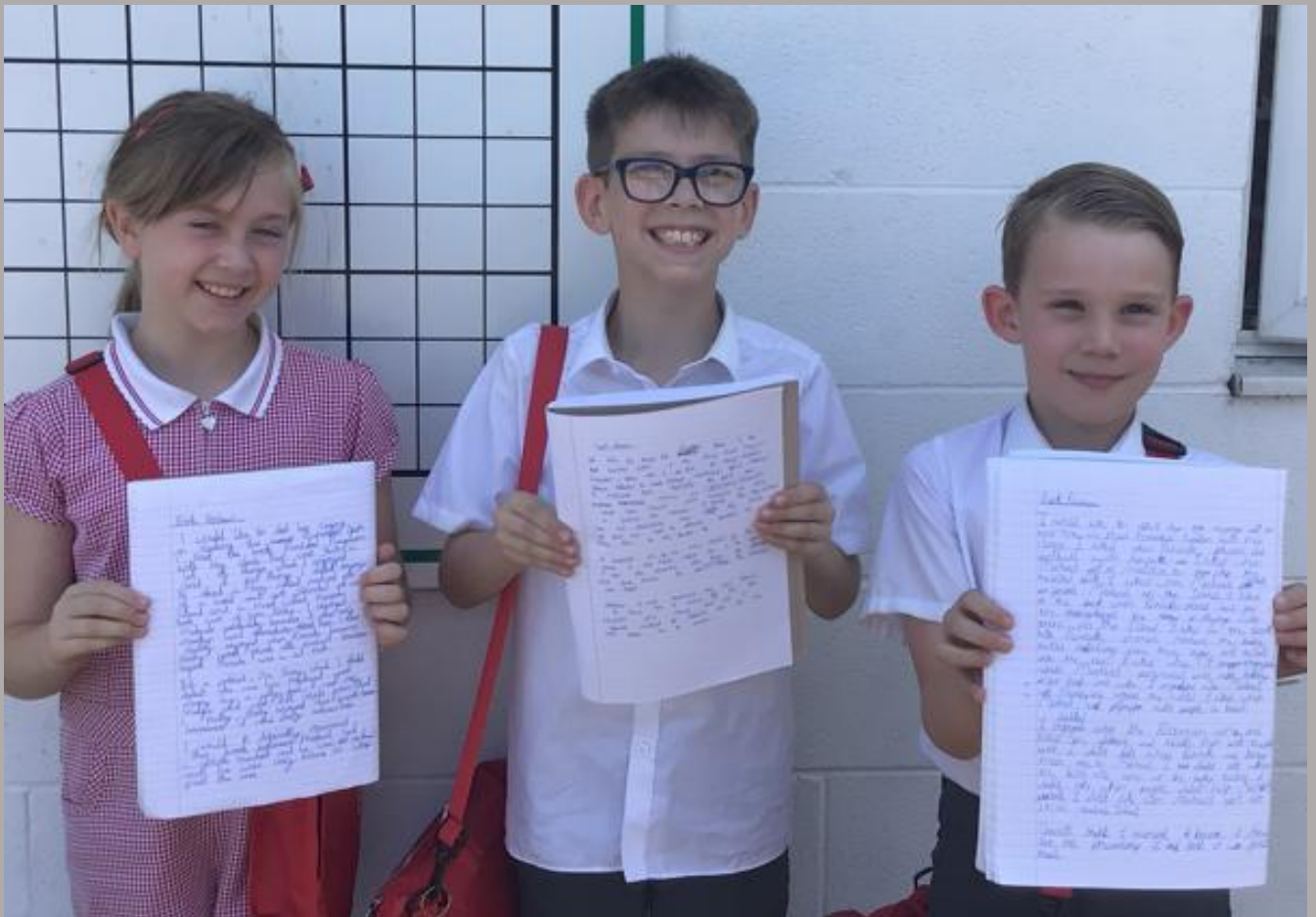


Our special focus in spelling this week is: adding 'il-' and revising un-, in-, mis-, dis-.

# Year 5 - Saint Raphael

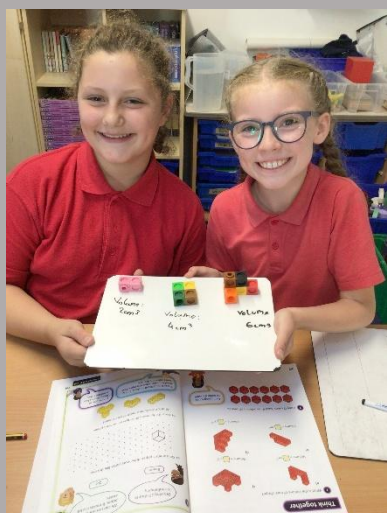
This week in Maths, we started our new unit on volume! We explored how to measure the space inside 3D shapes and used manipulatives like cubes to help us understand the concept better. It was exciting to build different shapes and see how volume changes depending on their size and structure. Using hands-on tools made learning more fun and helped us visualize what volume really means.

# Year 6 – Saint Maximilian Kolbe

This week, Year 6 students took part in a thoughtful and inspiring cross-curricular lesson that combined spirituality, technology and art. The children began their session in the school's Prayer Garden, a peaceful space that provided the perfect setting for reflection and observation. Using iPads, they captured a range of photographs including delicate flowers, peaceful statues and the gentle play of light through the trees. Back in the classroom, the children printed their favourite photos and used them as the basis for a unique watercolour project. With careful attention to colour, shape and texture, each student transformed their photograph into a beautiful piece of artwork that expressed both their personal interpretation, and the sense of calm found in the Prayer Garden. This activity allowed pupils to develop their artistic skills, while encouraging them to slow down, observe the world around them and reflect on the spiritual elements of their environment. Well done to all of Year 6 for producing such thoughtful and creative work.

## Reminders

### Stock up your child's pencil case

Please ensure your child has a transparent pencil case with the following resources in it: handwriting pen with blue ink e.g. manuscript brand (not a biro), biro with purple ink for editing, pencil, 30cm ruler, rubber, sharpener, glue stick, whiteboard pen and a small selection of coloured pencils, no felt tips. Some children have started to bring in alternative pencil cases, if they don't have an appropriate pencil case, we will provide one (and charge parents on scopay) as we will be keeping a small stock in the school office. We will also keep a small stock of some other resources such as handwriting pens and glue sticks which we will give to children when they run out and then charge parents via Scopay.

### School Absence

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carer per child, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.

### Safeguarding

We seek to provide a safe and happy environment for all children. This means that we have a Child Protection and Safeguarding Policy and procedures in place. ### 😊 Introducing the new Friends committee 😊

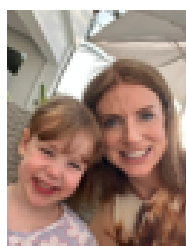
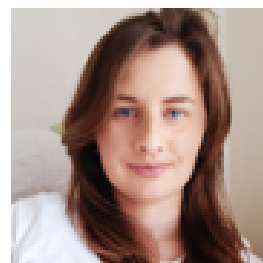

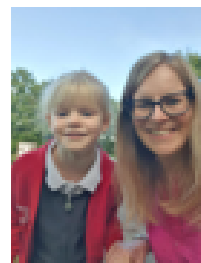
