Multi-faith week

An important part of our Come and See RE curriculum is to teach children about all the major world religions and this week has been multi-faith week.



Year 1 have been learning about Hinduism. Raksha Bandhan, is the Hindu festival that celebrates brotherhood and love. During the festival, sisters tie a Rakhi, a bracelet made of threads, around their brothers' wrists to celebrate their relationship. We made our own bracelets to share with our siblings. Year 6 have been looking at Sikhism, learning about their key principles: Nam Japna, Kirat Karma and Vand Chakna, while year 2 have been exploring the Islamic faith, they have been describing how Muslims prepare for prayer at home and the importance of family life.
