Budding scientists in year 3



Year 3 have been learning all about the digestion system in science this week and have had lots of fun recreating the journey of our food through the body! They learned about what happens to food in the stomach and how our body gets the nourishment it needs.

Amazing year 1 artists

The teachers at school have been redesigning our art curriculum recently, and the new lessons are proving to be a real hit with the children. This week in Year 1, the children have been developing their art techniques by using colour, line, shape and space, to create an under the sea picture. They studied two pieces of artwork and listened to a piece of music from Claude Debussy called 'La Mer'. The children worked collaboratively on one large piece of art and used a variety of different materials to make different types of marks. When the music stopped, the children had to change materials and direction -

they thoroughly enjoyed their formal elements art lesson this week and I think the work they produced was spectacular!

School Library Update

We are so lucky at St Hugh of Lincoln Primary to have a wonderful new library full of exciting books to read. We had another delivery of books this week from Hampshire School Library Service and our children really enjoyed looking at some of the new books.

If your child has an overdue book, we will let you know with an Overdue Library Book slip in their book bag. No one wakes up in the morning with the goal of losing or damaging a library book - accidents happen. However, if the book can't be found, then a replacement charge of £5 per book will become payable (we are charged by the library service for missing books). Parents will be able to pay the lost book charge via our school payment system, Scopay. If the missing item is located after payment, it becomes the property of your family.
