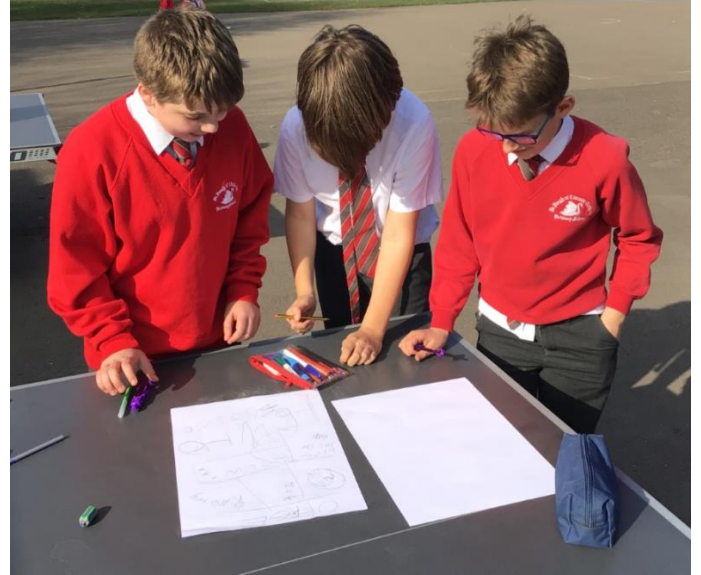
Learning about Coastlines in Year One
