
Dear parents and carers,

Gospel Values

Our RE followers met last week to talk about the Gospel values and how we teach and live them out at school. They decided that they would like to focus on a different value each half term, starting with, "thankfulness," as our current focus. The other values they chose as a focus throughout the year are:

Autumn 1: Respect Autumn 2: Friendship Spring 1: Thankfulness Spring 2: Forgiveness Summer 1: Love Summer 2: Hope

We began our focus on thankfulness by taking part in the Beelieve Foundation, "Blue letter day," initiative which encourages children to reflect on gratitude and all the things they are thankful for. The children then wrote a letter to someone to say thank you and these will be delivered over the coming week, hopefully giving everyone a well-deserved boost to their sense of wellbeing. Here are some lovely examples from year 2.



Reception class - RE

Reception have been busy learning about the miracle of Jesus turning water into wine as part of their RE topic on celebrations. They started off talking about celebrations that take place in church, especially weddings and they, then were able to explore the Gospel by re-enacting the story through Godly play as well as getting messy outside pouring water and adding dye to turn it into "wine".





3D Computer Modelling in Year 6

Year 6 have been challenging themselves this week to learn how to use 3D models on the ipads using modelling software called Tinkercad. The children's results were fantastic and they really enjoyed their learning.





Art and science in Year 3

In their art lessons, Year 3 have been painting like cave artists would have in Pre Historic times! First, they collected natural items and made marks with them. Then, they created paints using natural ingredients.





As part of their topic 'What plants need' in science, this week Year 3 have been investigating how much water a plant needs to stay healthy. They worked together in groups to set up their investigation, ensuring it is a fair test. Each day, they have watered the plants and recorded their observations and results in a table.

Covid update

Unfortunately, we are still experiencing a high number of Covid cases in school (children and staff) with all classes across KS2 being particularly affected. As before, if you have access to lateral flow tests, it would be a sensible precaution to test your child over the weekend to try to pick up asymptomatic cases and help us to contain the spread. Please be assured that we are working with Public Health England and have implemented the additional safety measures I spoke about last week. We are doing everything we possibly can to maintain the children's usual experience of school, but as before your child may be taught by a different member of staff until we are over this current spike in cases.
