Dear parents and carers,

I don't like to start the newsletter talking about Covid, but unfortunately we've got a growing number of cases across the school and I want to explain what we're doing to try and manage the situation.

Due to the increase in cases, we are going to step back up some of our preventative measures to hopefully isolate case numbers. These measures will involve:

- Children being taught at their desks rather than seated on the carpet (apart from Yr R)
- Teaching in rows rather than in table groups wherever possible
- Avoiding using the shared cloakroom areas
- Sitting in separate class areas in the hall for lunch
- Not attending whole school assemblies in the hall
- Any shared equipment being sanitised before use

We will continue with our existing measures such as regular hand washing, cleaning regimes and keeping the school building well ventilated. We are using the CO2 monitors to tell us when to open the windows and doors, but during this cold weather, the classrooms will inevitably be colder than usual. We will do our very best to balance the need for ventilation with comfortable classroom temperatures but it would be a good idea to send your child to school in a few extra layers if the weather continues to be cold.

How you can help:

If you have access to LFD tests, please test your child in the next few days as it will help the school limit asymptomatic transmission. If your child tests positive, report it to the school and NHS and please note that there is now no need to seek PCR test in this circumstance. LFD tests can be ordered from the NHS. What to do if your child develops symptoms of Covid or tests positive:

We would ask you to keep an eye on your child and if they develop any signs of illness that could indicate coronavirus (COVID-19), i.e., temperature, cough, loss of taste or smell or cold like symptoms, they should get a PCR test (not an LFD) and remain at home at least until the result is known. PCR tests can be booked online. If negative, the child can end self-isolation. If positive, the child should follow the current isolation rules. These are changing on Monday 17th and are explained in this document:
