Mindfulness at St Hugh









On Friday 6th May, the children were very lucky to take part in Mindfulness workshops led by Mrs Martin. The children thought about why they were grateful and were taught strategies for relaxation. Some classes were also taught about managing their worries and being positive. Thank you so much Mrs Martin for giving up your time and teaching us how to look after our well-being.

Phonics Teaching – Read Write Inc

Over the last few months, Mrs Grace and our reading lead, Miss Bye, have been doing lots of research into the most effective ways of teaching children to read. As a result of their work, we have decided to change the way we teach phonics. Starting after half term, we will be using a programme called, Read Write Inc. (RWI) and at our INSET on Monday, all of our staff will be trained on the new scheme. Different parts of the programme are being introduced at various stages with a view to the complete programme being introduced by start of the autumn term. We will be arranging parent workshops to explain the RWI programme to you so you know how and why we teach phonics in the new way and what you can do at home to support your child. We'll be in touch in the coming weeks with some dates for these workshops.



Habitats in Year 2

Year 2 have been learning all about habitats in their Science this week. They could identify that most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and they could describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on each other. They had a lot of fun finding out and drawing the animals and plants in their chosen habitats.



Year 1 Computing

In this lesson, we focused on programming the Bee Bots to move forwards and backwards. We all know that Bee Bots only follow clear commands in a precise and repeatable way. We were all able to predict the outcome of a sequence involving the forward and backward commands.





Reception class trip to Painshill Park

On Wednesday, Reception had the most wonderful day at Painshill Park. They spent the morning on a 'Minibeast Safari' and were amazed by all the creatures they found in some of the different habitats there including beetles, caterpillars, woodlice, spiders, millipedes, centipedes and much, much more! In the afternoon, they enjoyed exploring the beautiful grounds and the crystal grotto provided lots of awe and wonder! We were so proud of the exemplary behaviour of the children and their enthusiasm to learn. The staff at Painshill commented on how impressed they were by our children's knowledge and behaviour. 





Dissecting flowers in Year 3
