# Design Technology in year 6

Year 6 have been studying textiles in their DT topic this term and have been busy designing and making waistcoats. They created patterns, cut their fabric and then learned to sew their pieces together to create a finished piece. They have really enjoyed it and have done a wonderful job!



## English and Science in year 1

The children in Year 1 are thoroughly enjoying their new English book 'Wild'. On Tuesday they studied the title page, pretended they were illustrators and described the main character. The children loved using the pastels to draw the character, this enhanced their thought for writing and developed their vocabulary. They have furthered their learning in Science learning by comparing the properties of different slimes! They all observed the four slimes closely and recorded the data in a simple table.





#### **Green fingers in Year 3**

Year Three have been very busy scientists this week, investigating what plants need. They created a 'hydroponics vase' to investigate whether plants need soil to grow. After two days, the onion had already grown some new shoots! They also made observations about different types of planting materials and predicted which they thought would be best for growing radishes. They are looking forward to seeing whether it is sand, stones, compost or garden soil. Their investigation into how much water pansies need to maintain good health is still ongoing too.



## Plea for help - can anyone sponsor some robots for us?

We have been working hard lately on our computing curriculum and have been collaborating with Woking High who are a national Computing Hub working with primary schools to improve their computing and STEM provision. During our INSET day on 16<sup>th</sup> March, all of the teachers are being trained on great ways to teach coding and we are excited about the impact it is going to have on the children's learning. We are thrilled to have managed to secure the funds to invest in 30 new laptops, which will be ready for the children to use in lessons after half term, but we would also love to be able to invest in some programmable robots recommended by the Hub to enhance the children's learning even further. I was wondering if anyone had contacts with a company I could approach to see if they would be interested in sponsoring them for us? In return, we can offer a mention on our website and in the newsletter. The cost of the equipment is approximately £1,000 and would buy a class "crumble" kit and a set of 6 programmable bee-bots.
