We didn't realise that we had so much wildlife in our school grounds!



Art in Year 4

Year 4 have been enjoying a new unit of work on Fridays in Art – they have been learning about painting and mixed media. They have learnt to mix tints and shades and this week used them to give a 3D effect when painting.



Telling the time in Year 3

This week in maths, Year 3 have been learning the important skill of telling the time. They have been working really hard to read and write the time from digital and analogue clocks. They practiced on mini clocks and challenged themselves to answer reasoning and problem-solving questions too. Next week, they will be learning how to convert between analogue and digital times.
