



Hot seating and weaving in Year 3



In English, Year 3 have been using the 'hot seating' technique. Hot seating is where a member of the class role plays a character from the story and is interviewed by their peers. The children thought carefully of open questions to interview 'Jub' the main character from their class text 'Lost Happy Endings'. Wearing a woolly hat, just like Jub helped the children get into character! The responses from this task will support the children with writing diary entries from the character's perspective.

In art, Year 3 have been learning what weaving is and then created their own piece of art using this method. First, they learnt about the artist Anni Albers who is a great weaver and explored her works. Next, they cut and folded with accuracy their strips of paper and then neatly weaved the paper using the 'under and over' technique. Well done Year 3, you were able to create some fabulous pieces of art!



Learning about the suffragettes in Year 6

In Year 6 we have been looking at the suffragettes and how they fought for the votes for women. We watched a video called "Derby Day" where Emily Wilding Davidson stepped in front of the king's horse at Epsom Derby. We then created our own interpretation of the Suffragette newspaper front cover the day after she passed away. We thought about the 3 colours of the suffragette flag (purple, white and green) and used them within our paintings.







Learning through play in early years

Reception are really enjoying the outdoor classroom! They are so good at using their imaginations, being creative and using loose parts to enrich their learning through play! We have our future artists, engineers and storytellers amongst us....







Science in year 4

In science, we are learning how living things can be grouped in a variety of ways. This week we thought about questions that would help us identify a species. We then started to learn about classification trees and created a classification tree for our class on the playground.






Mass for Year 6
