
Year 2We have been preparing for Pentecost by writing some beautiful prayers to the Holy Spirit.

Year 4

The year 4 children had a wonderful day in London this week for their summer school trip. They attended the Bright Sparks children's concert at the Royal Festival Hall on the Southbank. Presenter Rachel Leach and the London Philharmonic Orchestra joined forces to guide pupils through the Slavic folk tale 'The Firebird' and excerpts from Igor Stravinsky's dazzling masterpiece. The Firebird suite is one of the most exciting and forward-thinking ballet scores, weaving a tale of good versus evil. This captivated the children and provided an unforgettable live concert experience. After the show the children walked a short distance to picnic in Jubilee gardens below the millennium wheel. After lunch they watched a street magic performer before having the chance to play in the Jubilee Garden playground before journeying back to school. The children enjoyed the day immensely, and for some was the first time they had ever been into London and ever seen a live orchestra. Their behaviour was excellent throughout with them being a real credit to the school. Well done year 4!












Year 5
