A national comparison shows how well we did:

In **reading**, 73% of pupils met the expected standard, down from 75% in 2022. In **maths**, 73% of pupils met the expected standard, up from71% in 2022. In **grammar, punctuation and spelling**, 72% of pupils met the expected standard, unchanged from 2022.

Reception

This week, Reception really enjoyed the story, *Who Sank the Boat?* It was a great stimulus for some fantastic problem solving and teamwork as they applied lots of mathematical and scientific thinking to try and balance their own 'boats' with loose parts. They demonstrated an excellent understanding of mass, floating and sinking with their strategies and we were all very impressed with their results!

This week in Year 2 we have been learning about 'treasures' in our R.E. lessons. The children talked about what they treasured in their lives and what was important to them. We used some resources from Cafod to help us to learn about the importance of clean water around the world and how it is one of God's treasures. The children were able to show how they appreciated and valued all of God's treasures through their drawings and writing.





Our outside classroom has been the perfect place for Year 3 to develop their understanding of capacity this week. We have been undertaking practical problems, estimating, measuring, comparing and ordering measurements. Our next challenge will be to convert between millilitres and mixed units of litres and millilitres. You can support your child by looking at the capacity of various items you have at home.





The year 4 children have enjoyed learning about the water cycle this week within their Science lesson. In the lesson they learnt that water can be found all over the Earth in the oceans, on land and in the atmosphere. They also discovered that the water cycle is the path that all water follows as it moves around our planet. There were many words that they learnt the meaning of such as evaporation, condensation and precipitation and they could accurately recall definitions for these as they had already learnt about these through scientific experiments from previous lessons. We were very impressed at some of the excellent illustrations of the water cycle that the children produced which showed a good application of this new knowledge. Many of the children were fascinated by the fact that all the water we consume has been through at least ten other people before us and that this would continue as the water cycle continued. Next week the children look forward to completing their final pieces of work within the unit. Well done year 4!





Year 5 have been learning about forces in their current Science topic. This week we focused on air resistance and the pupils created their own sails using different resources. In their groups, they decided on the structure of the sail and then each group added the sail into the boat and tested if it was successful or not.



This week Year 6 have been celebrating their fabulous SATS results with some extra play time and football. We are so proud of the effort they put in and all of their hard work. WELL DONE YEAR 6!


Year 5 Girls – Lucky Dip and Sale


