






Through their practical investigation, they also discovered that the greatest possible remainder is one less than the number they divide by. "It can only be three, because if you have four it will be a whole set."





The year 4 children have been having great fun within their maths lesson this week as they completed some practical maths tasks. They worked in different groups to solve problems on whiteboards using a variety of resources. The activities asked them to solve mathematical problems or puzzles, recognise different types of numbers and add several numbers mentally. The children enjoyed the free flow nature of the tasks, and worked well in a variety of groups as they completed each activity. Some great maths problem solving through teamwork. Well done year 4!













With all the festivities happening in school this week, we had some extra Christmas kindness in Year 5. Some of the pupils in the class came up with the idea of Secret Kindness Santa. It involves all the class and adults, and everyone has been secretly given a name. #### **Term Time Absences – Government Guidance for parents**

From 1 September 2013, a change to government legislation meant that schools are no longer allowed to authorise requests for children to be taken out of school during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. These circumstances will be determined by the child's head teacher, including the number of school days a child can be away from school, if leave is authorised.

Regulations ask that parents allow enough time for the head teacher to consider requests before leave is taken. If the head teacher refuses permission, each parent may be issued with a penalty notice, or prosecuted. Penalty Notices are issued by the Local Authority in accordance with Surrey County Council's Code of Conduct. The Penalty Notice is £60 per child per parent/carer, if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after 21 days but within 28 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in parents being served a summons to appear at the Magistrates Court.
