This week, Reception have been learning about the life of King Charles III. They found it so interesting exploring photos of the King as a baby and small boy and sequenced them accurately to show how he has grown and changed throughout his life. The children enjoyed reliving their memories of the King's Coronation and the different ways that the country celebrated – It is hard to believe that it was a whole year ago already! They loved reading the story, *The King's Hats*, and this was a powerful stimulus for some fantastic writing. We are so proud to see how far the children have come on their writing journey. It is incredible to watch them apply their phonics so independently – well done children! The children also loved using their drawing skills to complete a portrait of King Charles III and we were so impressed to see how carefully they thought about the position and size of his features in their own art work!


Year 5 - Saint Raphael


