The Outdoor Classroom is taking shape!









Year 1

At the end of last half term, the children completed their puppet designs. This week, the children asked to show their puppets to the Reception class. The children worked very hard to sew two pieces of fabric together, they then designed and decorated their puppets and then evaluated them. In Computing we used BeeBots to explain what a given command will do. We focused on the direction command buttons, as well as buttons to clear memory and run programmes.



Year 2 have started their new Science topic for this half term-Growing plants. They enjoyed observing with a hand lens and sorting a variety of seeds into different groups. They chose one of the seeds and predicted what they thought it might grow into. Afterwards they were able to draw the stages of the seed growth and label it with scientific vocabulary.







This week we started our new Geography topic, Our World, and the classroom was full of excitement as we made our own papier-mâché globes. For many of us it was the first time we had completed a papier-mâché project. We will be learning about the different imaginary lines we use to help us talk about places around the world. Our globes will be turned into a world and over the next few weeks we will be using them to create our own world map and talk about it using geographical terms.









Year 4

The year 4 children have enjoyed beginning their new science topic this week that is all about sound. They has fun playing sound Bingo at the beginning of the lesson, with them trying to guess the source making the sound. They then went on to explore how sound can be classified and generated many different types of words that could be used to categorise them. After classifying sounds in the classroom, they ventured out into the school grounds to take a moment of quiet to hear the sounds in the background that we often do not pause long enough to appreciate. Many noted things like cars in the distance, birds tweeting and children moving onto the playground. They look forward to the next few lesson whereby they will be looking at investigating volume and how different pitch is achieve within tuned instruments.




In year 5, this half term we have started our unit on drawing and specifically space imagery. This week, we looked at 'The family on the moon' which was an image created in the 1960s. It was what the artist imagined space would be like in the future. The class looked at the image and evaluated by thinking about the tone, texture, shapes, line and patterns. They came up with some lovely ideas about what the family were doing on the moon and really looked closely at the artistic imagery of the picture.





This week we started our new topic in science called 'changing circuits'. To start off the topic we constructed circuits and drew them using scientific symbols. We did come across a few problems during this and we created a fault finder to help us to troubleshoot it and fix our circuit.










World Book Day
