RSE – Journey in Love

As part of our commitment to work in partnership with parents, when teaching our RSE curriculum Journey in Love, we like you to be aware of the topics that are going to be taught this term so that you can discuss with and be prepared for any questions your children might ask.

In the autumn term, the children were taught about "Social and Emotional" love, in the spring term children are taught the "Spiritual" unit and in summer term the children are learning the "Physical lessons". The Physical learning intention for each year group is:

Reception class: To recognise that we are different and unique

Year 1: To recognise how I am cared for and kept safe in my family

Year 2: To celebrate ways of being safe in our communities

Year 3: To describe and give reasons why friendship can break down, how they can be repaired and strengthened.

Year 4: To describe how we should treat others making links with the diverse modern society we live in.

Year 5: To show knowledge and understanding of the physical changes in puberty.


Year 6: Explain how human life is conceived.

Year 2 – Saint Francis

Happy Week 2! We have had a busy week in Year 2! In English, inspired by our book "The Bee Who Spoke", we wrote elaborate descriptions of what we can see through our classroom window, using expanded noun phrases and conjunctions. In maths we continued with our unit "Problem solving, efficient methods", exploring new ways of add and subtract two-digit numbers using different resources. In Science we classified food labels into plant, meat and both depending on the ingredients, and in History we used photographs to learn about the life of Ethel Smyth, one of our local heroes. In RE we read the scriptures from St Paul (Colossians 3: 10-17) and learn what God asked us to do and how to behave, the rules of our Catholic church. The highlight of our week has been DT, where we made different linkages in preparation for our final project, a moving monster.

Year 3 – Saint Veronica

This week we have taken inspiration from our biographic book One Plastic Bag. In our book Isatou creates a bag from recycled materials and sells it. We have designed our own bags and written persuasive speeches to give to the class. We have thought about our language choices using imperative verbs, rhetorical questions and subordinating conjunctions, to persuade our peers that our bag is the one they need. Well done Year 3, we have loved seeing all your creative ideas, we have everything from amazing sports bags, to elaborate animal carriers.

Year 4 – Saint Teresa of Calcutta

In PE this week the Year 4 children were focusing on their co-ordination skills. Children were able to confidently explain what was meant by co-ordination and in what daily life activities and sports they use their co-ordination. Within the lesson, children focused on their throwing and catching utilising their hand and eye co-ordination skills. Alongside this, the children ended the lesson with a fun game, where they were in 6 teams of 5 and they had to perform 'over and under' with the ball and use their team work and co-ordination skills in order to successfully complete the game.

Orange words: experiment, knowledge, sentence, disappear, early, particular




Year 5 – Saint Raphael

In the intervention group, we looked at multiplying decimals with whole numbers (X10) using manipulatives. 



Our 6 orange words are: ordinary, occupy, privilege, persuade, conscious, restaurant
