Reception Class

This week Reception have been reading *The Little Red Hen* and have been exploring farming, in particular, have focused on how the process of growing wheat, harvesting crops and turning the wheat into flour has changed over time compared to the huge machinery and milling factories that are used today. They have learnt about how wind and water mills were used in the past to grind the grains to make flour. They used mortar and pestles to grind grains to make flour - it was hard work but the children persevered so well! They also made their own dough using flour, yeast and water and made a delicious loaf of bread! We hope the children enjoyed tasting their sample at home! On Wednesday, Reception were lucky enough to visit Pizza Express in Woking to make their own pizzas! The children were beautifully behaved and were so proud of the delicious pizzas that they made! Thank you so much to the team of wonderful parents and grandparents who transported the children and supported them during their visit!







Year 1 Geography

During our first Geography lesson of the term, we began our new topic 'People and their communities'. This week, we were discussing which country of the UK we live in, we discussed that our closest town is Woking and we can describe the main characteristics of Woking. We even spotted the Union Jack flag in the atlas!






Year 2

Year 2 children have been continuing their Science investigating this week. They have been identifying common features of materials and predicting which material will be the most and least stretchy. We had a great discussion about which materials would be the most stretchy and why they needed to be stretchy.





Year 3

This week in Latin Year 3 played a game Euge! To recap nouns and adjectives agreeing. It was a bit like pairs or snap.

In History we are using sources to find out about the Bronze Age. We worked in groups to see what we could find out about the Amesbury Archer from his grave. Our discoveries helped us build up a picture of what life in the Bronze Age was like.









Year 4

The year 4 children have been learning about the different types of teeth and their functions within their science lesson this week. They used different colour playdough to physically make each type of tooth and labelled it with its name and what it is used for when we eat. The children then looked at comparisons with their teeth and other animals and learnt about how teeth were adapted to the type of diet a creature would typically eat. Many of the children commented on how fun this task was and how making the replica teeth helped them learn the names and function easily. As we continue, we look at how to keep our teeth healthy before looking in more detail at other parts of the digestive system within the unit Human Nutrition.



Year 6

This week in English we have been focusing on drama. We started off the week by looking deeply at the characters and interviewing them in the hot seat. We then analysed the text and thought about the thoughts, feelings, and the tone of voice that characters might be using. On Tuesday, we did some amazing acting in groups to look at the features of a play script. Finally, on Wednesday and Thursday we have been writing our own play script for an extract in our book, Private Peaceful.

In some instances, a young person's online presence will define their offline lives. The choices about the information they share and how they behave online has consequences for their safety, their education, their wellbeing and other life experiences. The sessions delivered to parents will help prepare their children for a safer life online.

The information provided during the parents evening with enable parents continue the learning at home.

Presentation

The information provided during the parents evening will link to the presentation given to their child and will enable parents to continue the learning at home. It will include all or some of the following:

- Online facts identifying young people's vulnerabilities;
- An understanding of what young people do online and the aspects of the activity they enjoy;
- What to look out for as young people engage in online gaming both from a user and parent perspective;
- Explanation of current games and some tips for parents
- An understanding of the basic rules of social networking and how to use it safely;
- An explanation of Facebook, Snapchat, TikTok, Instagram, Twitter; WhatsApp, and other current
 applications used by our young people;
- How to set up your devices with step-by-step guides;
- Useful resources, solutions and top tips.

The presentation is for a period of 60-75 minutes.

Presenter

Sharon Girling OBE is a former police officer who retired following thirty years' service. She was at the forefront of a national and international response to online child abuse and developed the processes and procedures that led to the creation of Child Exploitation and Online Protection Centre. Her final role was as an investigator at the CEOP. Sharon is currently delivering training programmes for schools, Premier League Football Clubs, The Scouts Association, law enforcement, charities and businesses both nationally and internationally.

Sharon has been awarded an OBE by Her Majesty The Queen for her services to policing the internet
