This week we heard in the Gospel, Jesus' Sermon on the Mount where He describes to the disciples the qualities and experiences that will lead to a person being rewarded or blessed by God. This list of blessings are known as the Beatitudes. This linked nicely to our focus on British values as we reflected on Holocaust Memorial Day. We thought particularly about the unfairness of discrimination of any sort particularly the racism suffered by the Jewish people in Nazi Germany and other occupied countries during World War 2. ### Reception

Reception have been exploring the book, Handa's Surprise. They have been using clues from the story and photographs of the amazing landscapes and wildlife to compare this part of Kenya with life here in the UK.

Additionally, the children have been inspired by the Italian artist, Giuseppe Arcimboldo. They have created their own fabulous portraits using just fruits and vegetables!

On Wednesday, we visited the Lightbox and listened to an interesting talk from Sharon Gurling about online safety. At the Lightbox we toured two of the galleries to search for stories within the pieces of art. This inspired our own story making skills and in groups we then made individual puppets. A big thank you to our parent helpers who accompanied us on the trip and to Mr O'Donovan who drove the class in the school minibus. Once we were back at school, we learnt about the four top tips of staying safe on the internet.

- 2. Be kind and nice to people on our devices.
- 3. Keep our information safe.
- 4. If we get a 'funny tummy' feeling you should tell a grown-up we trust.







Year 2 have been out and about on a Texture Hunt for their Art lesson. They were able to describe colours and choose materials to create a texture. Afterwards they went exploring outside as Texture Detectives to find different surfaces. Next time they will be using all their textures that they found and created to make a collage.









Year 3 have been working hard in DT this half term learning about the impact the digital revolution has had on product design. We have been creating eCharms. We used a template to make a pouch for our eCharm and decorated it to appeal to a specific user. Then this week we had a very exciting lesson writing a programme to make an LED light flash different colours as part of our eCharm. Next week we will be thinking about point of sale displays for our eCharms.





The year 4 children had great fun on their trip to Sayers Croft as part of their Geography learning on rivers and the water cycle. They began the day by completing an orienteering task whereby they needed to look for landmarks and follow clues to unscramble words for a word search. After that, they took part in a water cycle game that helped them practically remember each stage of the process. Shortly after this they journeyed to a nearby stream to complete a river sketch, study and pollution investigation. Many of them found lots of animals within the stream which proved the water had little pollution present. The day finished with them building a shelter out of natural resources. All commented on what a fantastic day they had, with many wanting to stay for longer. We were proud of their excellent behaviour and particular the teamwork they demonstrated throughout the day. Well done year 4!
