# Year 2 – Saint Francis

We have had a lovely third week of learning in Year 2. We started the week with Sports Day where we competed in running races and relay races. We demonstrated our sportsmanship cheering and applauding our friends that were running and our resilience when we perhaps couldn't finish the race in first place. It was such a lovely day! Thank you for the parents that could come to watch. In maths this week we finished our problem solving unit and now we started "Positional Language". In Science we learned the difference in between carnivore, herbivore and omnivore and the relationship in between the animals of a habitat illustrated in food chains. In History we learned about the Bedser brothers, two local heroes of our community. In DT we design our moving monster labelling the levers and pivots it has and in RE we discussed good choices and bad choices or sins. We also learned the importance of repentance and forgiveness.

What a fabulous, fun morning we had at sports day in the sunshine! It was a joy to see all of the children in Year 3 showing great team spirit and sportsmanship, we are very proud of you all! In maths this week, we have continued our learning on time, practicing telling the time to the nearest minute on digital and analogue clocks. It would wonderful if you could continue to practice this valuable skill at home too please. In science, we are enjoying our 'light and shadows' topic. We described how shadows are formed and had a go at making animal shadows with our hands. Then, we investigated how different materials make different shadows and sorted them into transparent, translucent and opaque.

# Year 4 – Saint Teresa of Calcutta

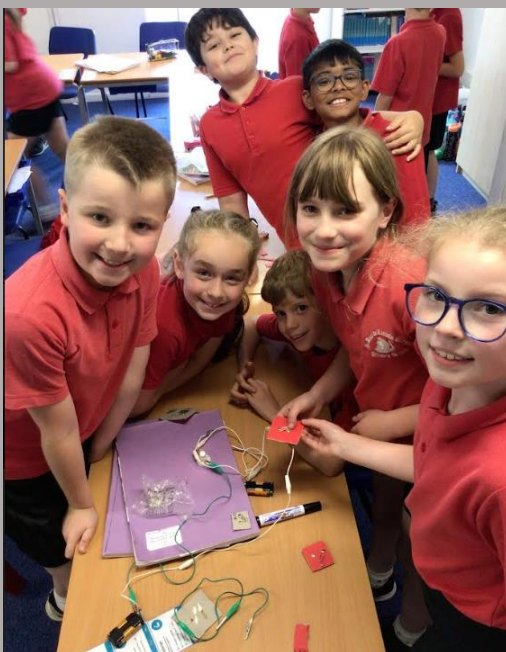
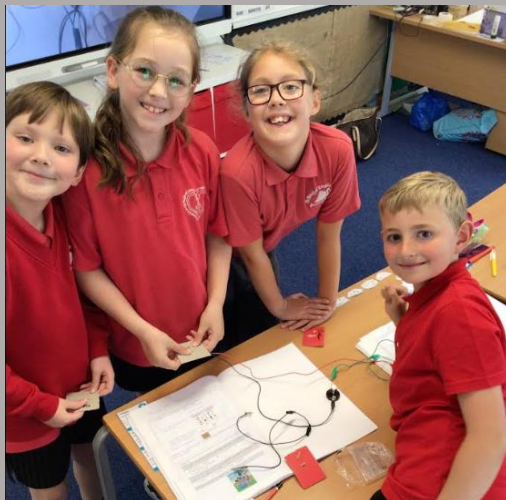
In DT this week the children have learnt all about electrical items and how they work. In the lesson they were able to identify electrical products, developed an understanding of what electrical conductors and insulators are and recognise that a battery contains stored electricity and can be used to power products. To practically demonstrate their knowledge, the children enjoyed creating their own switch out of cardboard, split pins and a paperclip to later include into their own electrical circuits.

**Orange words:** learn, forward, length, knowledge, interest, natural.



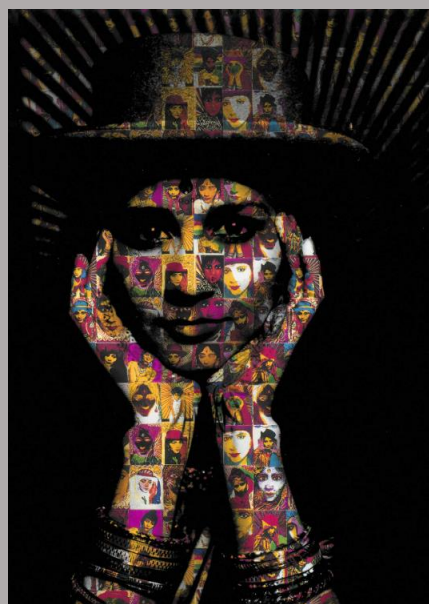


# Year 5 – Saint Raphael

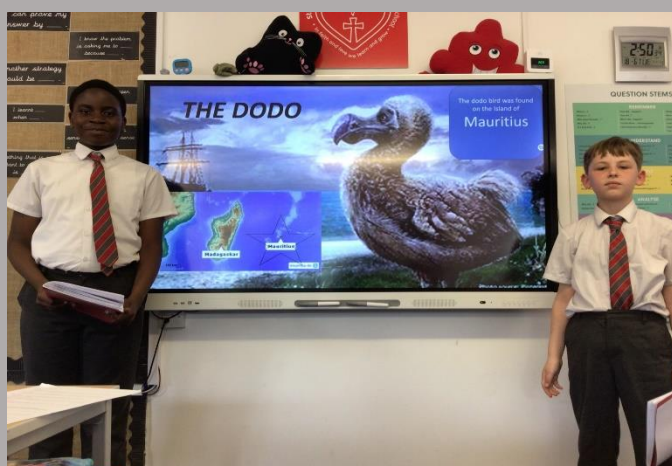

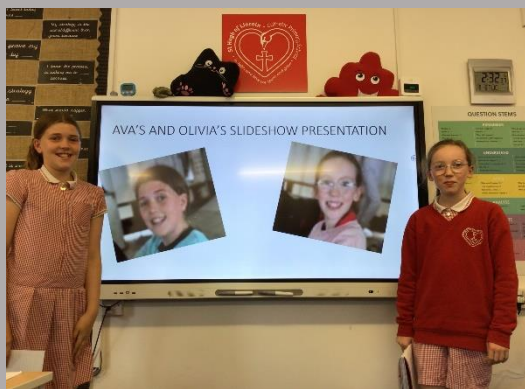
# Year 6 – Saint Maximilian Kolbe

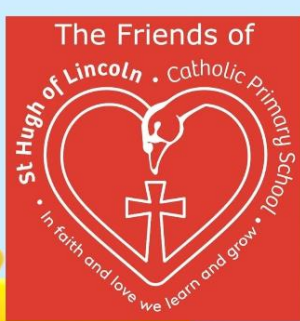
