Year 1

Year 2






The children in Year 2 had great fun learning about the properties of different materials in their Science lesson this week. They were able to explore slime (corn flour and water) in their hands by rolling and pushing it, and they had lots of questions to ask each other about its 'magical' properties. They learnt how the slime behaves like a liquid when it is stirred slowly but a solid if it is stirred quickly. Their new science word of the week was Non-Newtonian.

Year 3

In English we spent time visualising what the old woman in Lost Happy Endings might looks like. We looked at the information the author had given us about her and used these descriptions to create a model of her. We will be writing our own character descriptions using expanded noun phrases later in the week.








Year 4 Trip to Haslemere Museum

As a class we visited Haslemere museum to learn about the ancient Egyptian civilisation. During the visit we had fun exploring artefacts and learnt many things about Egyptian rituals relating to the gods worshipped during that period. We completed a practical activity that helped us understand each step of the embalming process, which culminated in us embalming our own soft toys!

The year 4 children have had fun within their learning this week as they begin their final compositions within their art unit 'Power Prints'. The unit of work has taken inspiration from many famous artists which include Henri Matisse, Georges Seurat and Edward Ruscha. These artists' work has linked with the different type of media the children have been practising and learning about in the weeks up to creating their final compositions. They have made a wonderful start, and we look forward to the children combining collaging, printing and sketching to produce an excellent piece of artwork for the end of the term.

Year 5

This term in DT, we have been creating Doodlers! These creations made different patterns when turned on and each Doodler created a slightly different design. The doodler worked by connecting a circuit with a buzzer that helped move the cup and the pens around. Year 5 were amazing at working in pairs to create them: there was a lot of problem solving and working with each other to adapt their designs to make them better.
