Dear Parents and carers,



Reception

This week, Reception have been exploring how to keep themselves healthy. In particular, they have been learning about the importance of a balanced diet. The children enjoyed exploring some of the foods from Miss Scott's cupboards and checking the nutritional 'traffic light' system on the packaging to find out how much fat, sugar and salt were each item contained. They sorted her a collection of 'treat' foods that she can still enjoy.... but not too often! The children and staff have made a pledge to make sure that they eat at least 5 portions of fruit and vegetables and 6-8 cups of water every day! The children have also thoroughly enjoyed learning about how to take great care of their teeth and have been practising cleaning a giant set of teeth for 2 minutes!



Year 1

Throughout this term, we have been comparing materials. We have:

- Described some of the physical properties of everyday materials, such as whether an object is rough/smooth, hard/soft, waterproof/not waterproof, or transparent/opaque.
- Made simple comparisons between these different materials.
- Sorted the materials into groups according to their properties.
- Raised questions about the properties of slime and answered these questions by carrying out a comparative test.

We now know:

- Some materials float and others sink in water and that some heavy objects float, and some light objects sink.
- Some materials allow a lot of light to pass through them, some allow only a little light through, whilst others do not allow light to pass through at all.

What fantastic scientific skills and knowledge we have learnt. Well done Year 1.





Year 2

Year 2 have been learning about measurement in their Maths lessons this week. They were learning how to measure in metres and centimetres. They had good fun measuring items around the school, especially the length of the school hall.



Year 3

Year 3 enjoyed a lovely, bright sunny day at Butser Farm, a great end to our Bronze and Iron Age topic. This wouldn't have been possible without the support of the parents who gave up their days to accompany us – thank you.




We took part in lots of activities including bronze age jewellery making – we used plyers to make our own rings and bracelets. We watched a demonstration on how to make a wattle fence and then had a go in teams at creating our own; we did an amazing job.

We visited Bronze Age and Iron Age roundhouse, we loved exploring the Iron Age roundhouse and seeing how things had changed since the Bronze Age. We were also able to handle artefacts from the Bronze and Iron Age.



Year 4

The year 4 children have been creating an 's' plan to recall all of the important events from their recent Sayers Croft visit. They enjoyed using pictures from the trip and putting them in chronological order. They also planned in some action sentences to include within their recount which they were drafting next. It was lovely for the children to use talk to help recall different highlights from the trip from each other and use this to add detail to their plan. Children also used their work completed on the trip itself, one example being the field sketch whilst on the bank of the river.

This week is internet safety week so year 5 and 6 took part in a virtual live assembly together with other schools across the country. They then took part in a quiz at the end about internet safety and why it is important to stay safe online.





Year 6
