#### **New Outdoor Classroom**

Work has started on our splendid new outdoor classroom situated in what was the 'Quiet Area' of the KS2 playground. The classroom itself will be a timber structure measuring 9m wide by 4.8m deep and it will seat up to 32 children. We aim to use this fantastic new space for outdoor lessons but also as a place to enjoy doing calm activities during playtimes.

After tree clearing, the first stage is to dig the drainage channels in preparation for the build. Health and safety guidelines are in place and those working on the site are all fully DBS checked. The area has been securely fenced off from the playground so that children cannot gain access but are able to watch the proceedings. This have proved to be a very popular spectator sport during break times!

## **Reception Class**

Reception have not let the wet weather put them off getting outside for their learning. The children loved exploring our new channelling equipment. We witnessed so much problem solving and critical thinking as the children communicated with each other using phrases like, "What if we move this piece down a bit;" "Let's see if a car will go down faster than the ball;" "I wonder how long we can make it;" "I think this will make it roll further!" They demonstrated great teamwork and resilience as they set themselves challenges and helped each other to be successful!



Reception also had a wonderful time visiting the Life Space on Wednesday. They learnt about the different parts of their bodies and what they do, how to look after themselves, how to keep healthy and how to manage challenging emotions. It was such a fun, informative and interactive session! The instructor commented on what wonderful children we have and he was so impressed with their knowledge and behaviour!







## Year 1 PSHE

Year 1 enjoyed learning all about our wonderful bodies in the Life Space with Mark. This lesson has prepared us for our Spring 2 PSHE topic 'Healthy Me'. We learnt about the different food groups, our bones, important muscles, and the well being wheel.

Ansel- "The digestive system moves the food through our bodies."


Alexa- "We have veins in our wrists."







In our science lesson this week, Year 2 have been learning about materials and how they can change shape by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching. They thoroughly enjoyed exploring and using their skills to change the shape of the playdough.




We started our new book The Firework Maker's Daughter in our reading lessons this week and are all intrigued to find out what is going to happen next. It was lovely to see the children working together during paired reading supporting each other with tricky vocabulary. This week we are reading chapter 1 together, thinking about the author's choice of vocabulary and making predictions about what Lila will do next.





The children in year 4 had fun drawing and labelling what happens to our food when we eat and digest it. They used their knowledge organiser along with a video clip to find out what happened at each stage and worked well in teams to present back to the class what they had created. They particularly enjoyed learning the meanings of some of the newly taught words such as oesophagus, digest and intestine in their work. Well done year 4!



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This week, in English, we have been learning about narrative poetry and, in particular, poems written by Michael Rosen. One of the poems we looked at is called 'I'm tired' – about two parents arguing about who is more tired. Year 5 then created their own poems based on two children arguing. The pupils had some very creative and amusing ideas, which were entertaining to listen to!

In RE we are starting our new topic of Sources. We will be looking at what types of religious sources there are and how we can use them to enrich our lives. To start the topic off, we went into the library and discovered what a source is and uses of different sources.

## Journey In Love (RSE Curriculum)


In 2021, our school consulted with parents on our relationships and sex education policy. As part of that process, we discussed that we have adopted the scheme of work called, "A Journey in Love," which is approved by the Catholic church and in line with Catholic teaching. At school we believe that RSE is best taught in partnership with parents and as part of this commitment, I will always let you know what is being taught and when so that you are able to reinforce the learning at home and answer any questions which may arise.

This half term, the children will be learning the first lesson in the Journey in love scheme which is all about the social and emotional aspects of healthy, loving relationships.

In the week beginning 16<sup>th</sup> January your children will explore the following learning objectives: Reception: To recognise the joy of being a special person in my family.

- Year 1: To recognise the signs that I am loved by my family.
- Year 2: To recognise the joy and friendship of belonging to a diverse community.
- Year 3: To describe and give reasons how friendships make us feel happy and safe.
- Year 4: To describe how we all should be accepted and respected.
- Year 5: To show knowledge and understanding of emotional relationship changes as we grow and develop.
- Year 6: To develop a secure understanding that stable and caring relationships, which may be of different types are at the heart of happy families.
