Year 4 – Saint Teresa of Calcutta

In Science this week, the year 4 children began the lesson by discussing where in the school grounds they would find living things, categorising the living things into vertebrates and invertebrates. Following this, the children were split into four groups and had to set up a scientific investigation, to identify and closely observe the types of living things that are present in our school grounds. Children wrote up their method before going outside and building their trap to attract living things. As a class we will be closely observing the outcome of the investigations to see what living things visit the traps, the findings will be recorded on a table of results in their books. We have already witnessed; after one day a woodlouse, ladybird and ants in the traps.

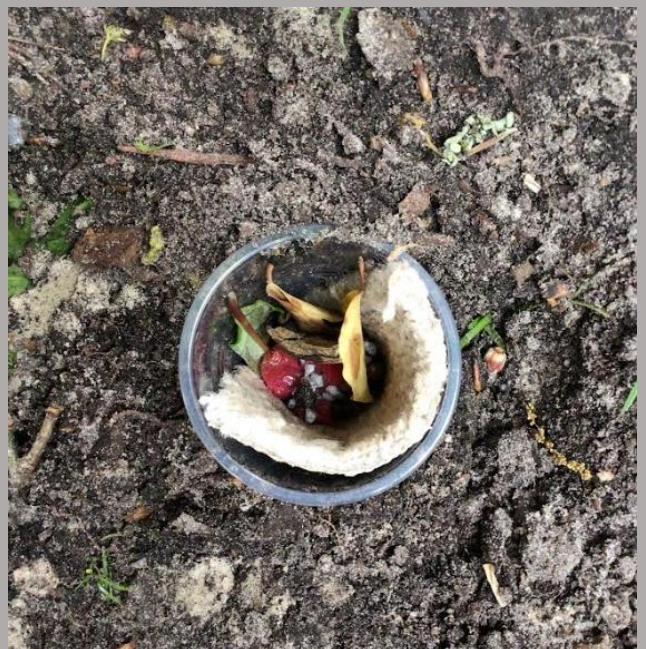


Our spelling rule this week is: words with the 'sh' sound spelt 'ch'
