This week we held our first Parent Consultation Evenings and I hope that you enjoyed hearing all about how well your child has settled into their new class. They are all such a credit to their families and they all show us every day how well they follow our 3 school rules: Ready, Respectful, Safe.

Our gospel this week was all about a woman who refuses to give up in search of justice. Jesus uses this story to impress upon the disciples how important it is not to lose heart and to never stop praying to God. Reception

To mark Black History Month, Reception have been celebrating the life of Nelson Mandela. We have been fascinated by his life and amazing achievements. The children have thought so carefully about what they would like to say to Nelson Mandela if he was still alive today.



Year 1

Windmills

We have finished designing and creating our windmills. This week we began evaluating the good and bad points about our windmills to help us improve our work for next time. We tested our windmills to find out if everything worked correctly. This was a great opportunity for the children to develop their problem-solving skills. Here are some ideas we came up with:

- If the windmill topples over when we attached the turbine, we could add more weight to the base or attach it to a larger base.
- If the turbine isn't able to turn, we needed check that it is not attached with tape or glue.



In Year 2 this week we have been designing, creating and testing our own mats for a floor robot. Their mat had to include squares to visit and squares to avoid. The design had to include code and algorithms which the children have been learning in their Computing lessons this half term. All the children were very successful in their designs and enjoyed working with their partners to program different routes for their floor robot to travel.



In DT, Year 3 have been learning about where our food comes from and thinking about how we can use seasonal produce. We all enjoyed preparing a seasonal crumble to take home and enjoy with our families.



More from Year 3...

On Wednesday, Year 3 were visited by Alex a meteorologist from the Met Office, as they will be learning about weather and climate after half term in geography. They found out about the difference between weather and climate, climates around the world and had a go at being weather forecasters! Finally, they had a chance to ask Alex questions about her job. A fantastic experience for the children, thank you to Mrs Willmott for arranging this for Year 3.







Year 4 have had fun completing their final compositions within their Art lesson this week. The children used a variety of methods to create their final pieces which included, printing, collaging and sketching to show proportion and tone within their drawings. The children chose a specific theme to base their artwork upon, these included: Queen Elizabeth, wealth, caring for one another and many more. We have been impressed with their development of skills over the term and their final compositions are a testament to their hard work and determination to produce an excellent piece of artwork.



In Art this week, we became 'architects'. Year 5 completed an observational drawing of a house and focused on the composition and proportion of their drawing. They used their pencils to help make sure all the elements were the right size and used different pencils to create shading. It was lovely to see how proud they were of their work and really impressed the adults with their creativity!



Year 6 have really enjoyed their class book Tom's Midnight Garden and today they wrote their own endings to this classic novel. Well done Year 6!



Eco Council Update

The eco-representatives have now completed their environmental review based upon the schools eco sustainability and presented their findings to the whole school. From their review, they have found that the school would benefit from launching a campaign relating to making sure people across the school are switching things off when they are not being used. Through an initiative run by The Pod, the school is taking part in Switch of Fortnight. This is a nationwide campaign that takes place every November to encourage schools to switch off lights and electrical appliances when not in use for two weeks. The goals for schools are to help them save energy and monitor the impact of changing user behaviour on the school's energy use. We look forward to them raising awareness of this more as we start the next school term. Great work Eco-team!

Term Time Absences

From 1 September 2013, a change to government legislation meant that schools are no longer allowed to authorise requests for children to be taken out of school during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. These circumstances will be determined by the child's head teacher, including the number of school days a child can be away from school, if leave is authorised.

Regulations ask that parents allow enough time for the head teacher to consider requests before leave is taken. If the head teacher refuses permission, each parent may be issued with a penalty notice, or prosecuted. Penalty Notices are issued by the Local Authority in accordance with Surrey County Council's Code of Conduct. The Penalty Notice is £60 per child per parent/carer, if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after 21 days but within 28 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in parents being served a summons to appear at the Magistrates Court. For further guidance:
