



## Climate and Weather



## Year 3 - Autumn

weather	Conditions in the atmosphere on a particular day, such as temperature, wind, rainfall, hours of sunshine or cloud cover
<b>☆</b> <b>☆</b> <b>climate</b>	Weather patterns in a place over a long period, such as seasonal rainfall, sunshine and temperatures
biome	An area defined by its climate, plant and animal life and the activities of the people who live there
climate zone	An area that has its own distinct climate - a similar temperature and precipitation.
fauna	Animals native to an area, such as birds, reptiles and insects
flora	Plants native to an area, such as trees, climbers, flowers and grasses

Temperate climates vary greatly at different times of year, with four distinct seasons.

The UK has a temperate climate.

**Polar climates** are usually below freezing and can reach -60°C in

winter. Polar areas are usually covered by snow and ice.



Tropical Climates have high temperatures, rainfall and hu-

midity all year. Some areas may have a wet and dry season.
