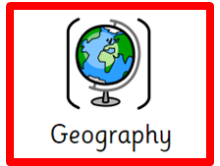











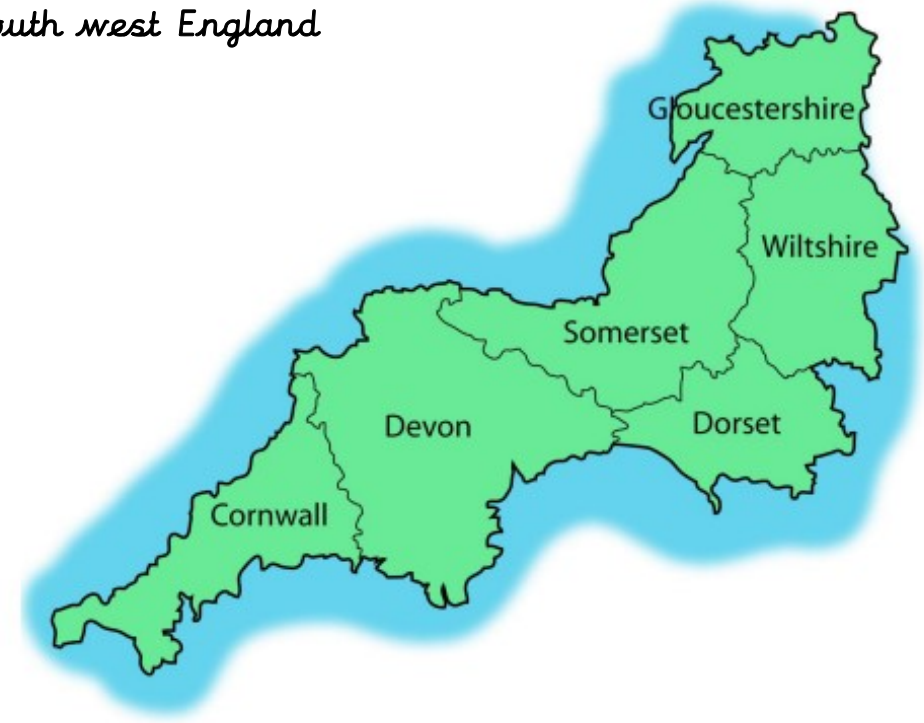
# Coasts

 <p>coast</p>	<p>The region where land meets sea.</p>
 <p>beach</p>	<p>A landform by water, usually of loose particles such as sand or pebbles.</p>
 <p>dune</p>	<p>Sandy mounds by the sea.</p>
 <p>cliff</p>	<p>A vertical or near vertical rock feature, usually on the coast.</p>
 <p>bay</p>	<p>An indentation of a shoreline, usually of softer rock.</p>
 <p>tides</p>	<p>The rise and fall of the sea caused by the movement of the moon and the sun.</p>
 <p>tourism</p>	<p>A worldwide industry based on travel for leisure, pleasure and business, and that provides attractions, and accommodation</p>
