















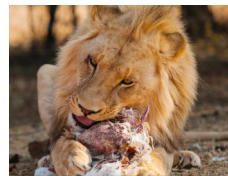


Types of Animals

Year 1 - Spring

<p>energy</p> 	<p>The power needed to do something.</p>
<p>growth</p> 	<p>The development of the body over time.</p>
<p>habitat</p> 	<p>The place where animals and plants live e.g. woodlands, coasts, and rainforest.</p>
<p>offspring</p> 	<p>The child of an animal..</p>
<p>skeleton</p> 	<p>The bones of the animal that give it its shape.</p>
<p>vertebrate</p> 	<p>An animal that has a backbone in its skeleton.</p>

Group	Animal example	Definition
<p>Mammal</p> 		<p>Most mammals have hair or fur. They give birth to live young rather than laying eggs.</p>
<p>Fish</p> 		<p>Fish are vertebrates that live in water.</p>
<p>Bird</p> 		<p>Birds are vertebrate animals that have feathers, wings, and beaks</p>
<p>Reptile</p> 		<p>Reptiles live on land. They have scaly skin. Reptiles lay their eggs on land.</p>
<p>Amphibian</p> 		<p>Animals that spend part of their lives in water and part of their lives on land. Amphibians lay their jelly-like eggs in water.</p>
