




# My Family History

<p>Timeline</p>	<p>Representation of a period of time, on which important events are marked.</p>
<p>Chronology</p>	<p>The order in which things happen.</p>
<p>Similar</p>	<p>When something is identical or the same.</p>
<p>Different</p>	<p>When something is not the same.</p>
<p>Past</p>	<p>Gone in time and no longer existing.</p>
<p>Compare</p>	<p>Note similarities in something/someone.</p>
<p>Artefact</p>	<p>An object made by a human being, typically one of cultural or historical interest.</p>
<p>Condition</p>	<p>The appearance, quality or working order of something.</p>




Toys today are usually made from different materials than in the past, for example plastic instead of wood or metal.
