<p>Roman Empire</p> 	<p>The name used for the land that was controlled by the Romans.</p>
<p>Caledonia</p>	<p>The name used in Roman times for Scotland</p>
<p>Picts</p>	<p>Tribes from Caledonia</p>
<p>Celts</p> 	<p>People living in Britain</p>
<p>emperor</p> 	<p>The ruler of an empire.</p>
<p>legion</p> 	<p>A large section of the Roman army, made up of 5000 soldiers.</p>
<p>centurion</p> 	<p>A Roman "army officer" in charge of about 80 soldiers.</p>
<p>Primary Source</p>	<p>Something from the time being studied, eg pottery, a diary entry, a piece of clothing</p>

The Romans established themselves in Britain and developed:

- paved straight roads
- infrastructure (e.g. sewage)

They also influenced the:

- written and spoken language
- measurement system
- way of life—they enjoyed leisure activities
